*<u>S6M-11914</u> John Mason: Reidvale Housing Association—That the Parliament recognises that members of Reidvale Housing Association in Dennistoun recently voted overwhelmingly to reject a takeover by the London-based Places for People Group; notes that the tenants voted by a majority of 61% to accept the takeover, with the members appearing to have gone against the wishes of the tenants; believes that Reidvale Housing Association was established as a result of a campaign to save tenements along Glasgow's Duke Street, and that it would be extremely disappointing if it were to lose its independence; considers, however, that the offer by Places for People to keep rents low and to invest considerable amounts in repairs and refurbishment has not so far been met by Reidvale itself, or by any other potential partner; acknowledges the efforts of the campaign group of Reidvale residents against the Places for People Group takeover; wishes the group well in its efforts to secure its future under community ownership for generations to come, and hopes that it has a plan to ensure that tenants do not lose out through this recent vote.

*<u>S6M-11913</u> Annie Wells: Time to Talk Day—That the Parliament recognises Time to Talk Day, which takes place on 1 February 2024; understands that Time to Talk Day is encouraging people across Scotland to have more honest conversations about how they are feeling, to help combat the stigma that still exists around mental health; believes that it is a day that friends, families, communities and workplaces come together to talk, listen, and change lives; recognises that the theme for the 2024 campaign is "What I really mean", highlighting that the words we say do not always reflect what is going on beneath the surface, and acknowledges that Time to Talk Day runs UK-wide, and that See Me Scotland runs the campaign in Scotland.

the forefront of space industry innovation; further understands that such research could have benefits in reducing space debris and maximising payload taken into space by such propulsion systems; notes that the team has received significant funding from the UK Space Agency, the Science and Technology Facilities Council and UK Research and Innovation; congratulates Professor Patrick Harkness, Krzysztof Bzdyk and Jack Tufft on their achievements, and wishes the research team luck while presenting its work at the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) SciTech Forum and Exposition in Orlando, Florida.

*<u>S6M-11909</u> Sandesh Gulhane: People's Palace and Winter Gardens in Glasgow Receives National Lottery Funding—That the Parliament welcomes the news that the project to restore Glasgow's People's Palace and Winter Gardens is to receive £850,000 from the National Lottery Heritage Fund; understands that this initial development funding will lead to a Heritage Fund second stage application to secure a further £6.65 million of support, which would be among the largest heritage awards to be given to a single project in Scotland; recognises that the People's Palace is home to collections documenting Glasgow's social history from 1750 to present, and is a much-loved building in the east end of the city; understands that the restoration project will redevelop the building, creating a dynamic community-led museum and flexible space designed to help inclusion, which is accessible and environmentally sustainable, and looks forward to the restoration and protection of this treasured cultural and heritage asset for visitors and generations of Glasgow citizens to come.

*<u>S6M-11904</u> Craig Hoy: Welcoming the Contribution of the Scotch Whisky Industry—That the Parliament welcomes the contribution of the Scotch whisky industry to the Scottish economy; notes that the industry supports 41,000 jobs in Scotland; understands that in 2022, the industry generated £5.3 billion gross value added (GVA) in Scotland; further understands that this accounts for 3% of Scotland's total GVA; notes that the industry accounts for 77% of Scottish food and drink exports, and recognises what it sees as the vital role of Scotch whisky distilleries, such as Glenkinchie Distillery, which supports tourism and agriculture in East Lothian.

*S6M-11884 Pauline McNeill: Creative Change Collective National Lottery Community Fund Award — That the Parliament congratulates Creative Change Collective, an arts charity that works towards reducing offending and reoffending rates, on its recent award of £5,383 from the National Lottery Community Fund; applauds the programme, which will create a film and radio group in Scotland's largest prison, HMP Barlinnie in Glasgow, and broadcast across other Scottish prisons; understands that the charity will use the award for equipment to be used in the production of its film and radio content; notes the previous work by the charity, with the creation of a scripted radio play around the theme of volunteering opportunities after release from prison, which was created and designed to support offenders to prepare for life outside of prison, making positive choices and helping them develop new skills and confidence; understands that Creative Change Collective uses the arts and creative processes associated with film, theatre and performance to help people achieve more positive outcomes, and that the charity also delivers a drama therapy programme, Anonymous Drama, to prisons; further understands that Anonymous Drama is also delivered to groups of participants serving community sentences, and in residential rehabilitation units to people in recovery from alcohol and drug addictions, and wishes the initiative well in its aim to ensure that many prisoners who would never otherwise consider being involved in arts or drama can access this outlet.
