### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-20268 Alexander Burnett: Fair Share of Funding for Public Services—That the Parliament notes calls for fairer funding to be allocated among Scotland's 32 local authorities and 14 NHS boards; further notes reports that Aberdeenshire Council is the fourth lowest funded local authority in Scotland, receiving less government funding per capita than the Scottish average; believes that NHS Grampian is the second lowest funded NHS board per head of population, is reportedly facing a deficit of nearly £50 million, has just 1.4 beds per 1,000 people, and has one of the fastest growing elderly populations in Scotland; considers that rural and island communities cover large geographical areas, which come with unique challenges and require significant resources, particularly with regard to infrastructure maintenance, service delivery and issues that arise from extreme weather; recognises concerns that local services are under immense pressure, and notes the view that it is important to ensure that communities are properly resourced to enable them to continue to have access to local services that meet their needs, including reliable public transport, local schools and health and social care services.

\*S6M-20264 David Torrance: Creative Coven—That the Parliament congratulates Rowan Morrison, and all at the Creative Coven, for exceeding their Kickstarter goal for their latest project WITCH - The Book of Remembrance; notes that this one-of-a-kind memorial publication features a huge range of poetry, art and prose to honour all those in Scotland accused and executed for the crime of witchcraft; understands that the Creative Coven tirelessly raises awareness of the witch persecutions in Scotland and has held two national days of remembrance in Fife and the event, Weaving Creative Threads, in Edinburgh; recognises that what it considers an innovative exhibition, *Voices and Visions of the Witch*, took place for three months in Fife as a creative response to what it sees as one of the most unjust human rights abuses in the past, and commends the Creative Coven for its commitment and dedication to honouring all those who lost their lives in what was a very dark period of Scotland's history.

\*S6M-20263 David Torrance: Sportscotland Scottish Sports Awards 2025—That the Parliament congratulates Martin Christie from Kirkcaldy on his outstanding achievement in winning the award of Volunteer of the Year at the sportscotland Scottish Sports Awards 2025; commends Martin's incredible 20-year history of volunteering and the many leadership roles he has undertaken at local golf clubs in the area; notes that Martin has a 32-year membership in golf clubs and, in partnership with the Fife Golf Trust, Martin developed a new six-hole golf course; appreciates that, in 2020, Martin established the charity, Dunnikier Park Community Golf, with a focus in accessibility and inclusion,
