***[S6M-21162](#) Annie Wells: Launch of SafeMates Youth Programme in Glasgow**—That the Parliament commends the launch of the SafeMates programme in Glasgow by the British Red Cross; notes that this peer-led initiative is supported by £750,000 of Scottish Government funding through the CashBack for Communities Phase 7 scheme, and that it aims to train more than 1,000 young people across Scotland over the next three years; recognises the value of SafeMates in empowering young people to provide peer support, build confidence and develop resilience, particularly in addressing challenges such as anxiety, exam stress and mental health concerns; understands the importance of early intervention and community-based support in improving wellbeing outcomes for young people; acknowledges the positive impact that similar programmes have already had in supporting thousands of young people in community and educational settings, and commends the efforts of volunteers, staff and partners involved in delivering this initiative, which will help ensure that young people across Glasgow and beyond have access to compassionate, peer-led support and opportunities to make a meaningful contribution to their communities.

***[S6M-21159](#) Annie Wells: Tollcross Care Home Marks Down's Syndrome Awareness Week—**That the Parliament congratulates Haydale Care Home on celebrating Down's Syndrome Awareness Week 2026 with its participation in Odd Socks Day; notes the creative and inclusive activities held at the care home, including arts and crafts sessions, themed discussions, and social gatherings designed to promote learning, understanding and connection among residents, staff, families and visitors; recognises the importance of raising awareness and fostering inclusion for people with Down's syndrome, highlighting the care home's commitment to celebrating diversity and individuality; understands the positive impact of initiatives that encourage conversation, reflection and community involvement in supporting equality and wellbeing, and acknowledges the dedication of staff, coordinators, residents and families in ensuring that the values of kindness, awareness and inclusion extend beyond the week into everyday life, strengthening the wider community in Tollcross and Glasgow.

***[S6M-21158](#) James Dornan: 25th Anniversary of the Daisy Project—**That the Parliament recognises the 25th anniversary of the Daisy Project, a Glasgow domestic abuse support service; notes that the project was established in 2001, in line with the introduction of the Protection from Abuse (Scotland) Act 2001, and developed from grassroots work with women in Castlemilk into a sustained, funded service; acknowledges that it now supports over 200 women and families each year and frequently operates at capacity; recognises its holistic, trauma-informed and client-led approach, shaped by the voices and experiences of women, and commends the dedication of its staff, volunteers and volunteer directors.

***[S6M-21157](#) Liam Kerr: Recognising the Work of Trading Standards Officers and SCOTSS in Tackling Illegal Tobacco Supply—**That the Parliament recognises the vital work of trading standards officers in Scotland, particularly in tackling the supply of illegal tobacco from retail shops as part of Operation CeCe, a partnership with HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC); congratulates the Society of Chief Officers of Trading Standards in Scotland (SCOTSS) on its coordination of this work and collaboration with HMRC in tackling the serious organised crime groups that it understands are involved in this illegal trade, which it considers blights Scotland's communities and increases the access to tobacco and the risks to health, safety and wellbeing for young people across the country; notes that, since 2020-21, this enforcement work has increased year on year and a total of five million illegal cigarettes and 1.2 tonnes of hand-rolling tobacco have been seized locally by council officers to date; commends the high public profile that has been achieved through local press reporting and filming with the BBC's *Reporting Scotland*, and looks forward to continued cross-party collaboration with SCOTSS in meeting future consumer protection challenges in Scotland.

***S6M-21154 Annie Wells: Glasgow's Citizens Theatre Recognised for Community Contribution**—That the Parliament recognises Glasgow's iconic Citizens Theatre, affectionately known as The Citz, for being honoured at the National Lottery's Big Night of Musicals, which was recorded in Manchester in January 2026; notes that executive director Kate Denby was recognised as a Local Theatre Hero for her outstanding leadership and dedication to the theatre's work in the community, and that she was interviewed on stage by comedian Jason Manford and presenter Gaby Roslin before an audience of 12,000; further notes that the theatre has been a cornerstone of the Gorbals since 1945, and that its historic building, dating back to 1878, recently underwent a major redevelopment, reopening in August 2025 with a new foyer, upgraded social areas, enhanced accessibility and improved facilities for performers and creatives; acknowledges that since 1995, the Citizens Theatre has received over £11 million in National Lottery funding, supporting redevelopment, creative outreach, heritage programmes and initiatives to make theatre accessible to all; recognises the theatre's ongoing commitment to educational and community engagement, including workshops, youth theatre projects and outreach programmes that provide opportunities for young people, local residents and diverse communities to participate in and experience the arts; notes that the theatre was featured as one of seven organisations in the National Lottery's Because of You series, fronted by Claudia Winkleman, highlighting the positive impact of National Lottery funding on communities across the UK; further notes that the recognition and awards will be showcased on BBC One, BBC iPlayer, and BBC Local Radio's Make a Difference Show, providing a platform to share the story of the theatre's creative work and its role in strengthening community engagement, and congratulates the Citizens Theatre, its staff, performers, volunteers and community partners on this well-deserved recognition and for their continuing commitment to fostering creativity, promoting inclusion and ensuring that theatre remains accessible and inspiring to audiences across Glasgow and beyond.
