# **REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: 2022-670524**

We acknowledge your request for the following information:

Could you provide me with copies of all information including, but not limited to, correspondence and messages exchanged between members, notes of telephone calls, emails and messages on the "Slack" social media tool, held by the Scottish Parliament and the LGBTI+ Cross-Party Group in the 6 weeks prior to the initial meeting of this parliamentary year on 1st September 2021.

Your request was received on 17 January 2022 and has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOI(S)A).

The information that you have requested is not held by the Scottish Parliament and therefore we cannot provide it to you. The Slack platform is used by Parliamentary Officials to communicate with colleagues about the operation of Chamber proceedings. It is not used to carry messages to Members, or to discuss the business of the LGBTI Cross party group. We do not hold any correspondence on the Slack social media tool within the period of your request.

In relation to your request for correspondence and messages between Members, the Scottish Parliamentary Corporate Body (SPCB) does not collect or store or have access to correspondence between individual MSPs. While the SPCB provides an IT framework to enable MSPs to communicate by email, parliament staff have no access to that system with the exception of technical staff required to resolve system problems which arise. This does not include accessing any of the actual data contained on the system. For the purposes of FOI legislation, this means that the Scottish Parliament does not hold any of the information contained in MSPs' email communications. Please note that MSPs and Cross-party groups are not covered by Freedom of Information and correspondence between Members is not subject to FOI(S)A.
