# **REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: 2022-671394**

We acknowledge your request for the following information:

In the light of this situation I am making a Freedom of Information request for:

- 1. The minutes of the meeting of the COVID19 Recovery Committee at which it was decided to put out a general call for views on Excess deaths in Scotland, and at which the five key questions to answer were identified.
- 2. A timeline for processing, posting, assessing, reporting and acting on the information solicited by the call (if this is not specified in the minutes of the COVID19 Recovery Committee meeting requested in 1. above).

Your request was received on 4<sup>th</sup> February 2022 and has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOI(S)A).

The COVID-19 Recovery Committee ('the Committee') considered a draft call for views, including the five consultation questions, for its inquiry into excess deaths in Scotland since the start of the pandemic at its meeting on Thursday, 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2021. The minutes of this meeting have been published on the Scottish Parliament's website.
