#### **REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: 2022-673144**

We acknowledge your request for the following information:

In the factors guidance issued to the Trustees by GAD dated 10 September 2020 a number of recommendations were made including that the Trustees should discuss the note. I can find no record in the minutes of the Committee that such a discussion took place. Please may I ask for a search for minutes and correspondence relating to these including emails that may include the terms "pension trustee", "pension transfers", "pensions factors", "GAD decision", or similar such terms.

Just one aspect of relates to the practice of accepting transfers in. It is not mandatory, confirmed by GAD and by reference to the Scheme Rules, to accept transfers in (rules 82) and indeed it is virtually unheard of in UK DB schemes, including the public service schemes, to do so without any restriction, given the significant risk transfer and selection risk that inevitably occurs. The SPPS continues to accept transfers. I'm interested to see the correspondence and better understand why the Trustees feel this is appropriate.

Your request was received on 18 March 2022 and has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOI(S)A). Please note that the Trustees of the Scottish Parliamentary Contributory Pension Fund (the "Fund Trustees") are not subject to FOI(S)A. The SPCB provides a secretariat to the Fund Trustees in order to assist and support the Fund Trustees. Information which the SPCB has access to in this role is not "held" by the SPCB in terms of s1(1) of FOI(S)A and is instead held by the SPCB "on behalf of another person" in terms of Section 3(2)(a)(i) of FOI(S)A. Accordingly, the SPCB cannot undertake searches of Fund Trustee information without their express consent.

We have identified a set of minutes of a meeting of the Fund Trustees on 18 March 2021 which is already in the public domain and which are relevant to the subject matter of your request; in particular item 5. These minutes can be accessed at the following link. 2021\_03\_18\_minutes\_final.pdf (parliament.scot).

In response to the second part of your request about accepting transfers in, the Scottish Parliamentary Pensions Act 2009 sets out the Rules of the SPPS, describing the provisions of the scheme that the Trustees need to follow. Part N Chapter 2 of the Rules covers the provisions which allow members to transfer-in benefits. However, there are a number of conditions and limitations (including capping of service) which must be satisfied as set out in Rule 81 and 83.

It is not mandatory for the Trustees to accept an incoming transfer payment, and they are entitled to impose such conditions regarding incoming transfers as they consider reasonable.

The additional risk to the Scheme as a result of accepting transfers in is managed through a combination of the provisions in the Rules (as referred to above) and how the Actuary and Trustees set the terms for transfer-in.
