REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: 2023-689529

We acknowledge your request for the following information:

It has been widely reported that since the SNP have held the sitting Government that the First Minister and Minister have not claimed pay awards from around 2008.

What I require under this FOI what authority does the Scottish Parliament have to not make full payment of salary awards to the First Minister and Ministers.

Can you confirm that the Parliament pays them the full amount or not.

If the full current salary is taken can you confirm or not if they pay the Parliament the money back or they pay the excess to the Scottish Government?

Your request was received on 20 June 2023 and has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOI(S)A).

Scottish Government Ministers are paid in accordance with the Scottish Parliament Salaries Scheme. The Scheme provides for a salary reduction only where an MSP is also a Member of the House of Commons or the House of Lords, or where an individual is imprisoned. It also provides that any increase in salaries will be directly linked to public sector pay rises in Scotland.

Scottish Government Ministers and Law Officers agreed to freeze their pay at the April 2009 pay level. The Salaries Scheme does not give the power to withhold a salary increase. In order therefore to implement the pay freeze the equivalent net value of the difference between Scottish Government Ministers' salary level at April 2009 and the current salary level is deducted on a monthly basis and payments are then repaid to the Scottish Government for payment into the Scottish Consolidated Fund.

We can therefore confirm that there is a mechanism in place to reduce the salaries paid to Scottish Government Ministers from the salaries published on the <u>Scottish Parliament website</u>. You can access information about the salaries paid to Ministers and Law Officers and the pay freeze commitment in the Scottish Government's Consolidated Accounts. The latest published version for 2021-22 (with salary information and details of the pay freeze commitment at pages 88 and 89) can be found on the <u>Scottish Government</u> website.
