Time for Reflection

The Presiding Officer (Alison Johnstone): Good afternoon. The first item of business is time for reflection. Our time for reflection leaders today are Holly Cameron and Aidan Coleman, who are Holocaust Educational Trust ambassadors.

Holly Cameron (Holocaust Educational Trust Ambassador): Hi. My name is Holly Cameron, and this is Aidan Coleman, and we are ambassadors for the Holocaust Educational Trust. We took part in the trust's lessons from Auschwitz project as students from Cumbernauld academy in November 2022. As part of the project, we heard from a Holocaust survivor and took part in a one-day visit to Auschwitz-Birkenau. On our return, we are sharing what we have learned with our school community.

I wanted to take part in the project because I have a passion for history, and it was an opportunity to advance my knowledge and to ensure that the stories of the victims are remembered for as long as possible.

As part of the project, we were privileged to hear from Holocaust survivor Eva Clarke BEM. Hearing her testimony—the story of her mother's survival and Eva's birth in Mauthausen concentration camp—was incredibly powerful. I am inspired by her dedication to keeping those memories alive when so many people cannot do so.

The visit to Auschwitz-Birkenau was extremely impactful, and I continued to learn about those who lost their lives as more than just a statistic—as individual people. I found visiting Birkenau particularly shocking. It was so vast and seemed never ending. I do not think that I will ever be able to forget that.

Aidan Coleman (Holocaust Educational Trust Ambassador): For our next steps project, we plan to deliver a presentation to the secondary 3, 4 and 5 history classes, in which we will pass on what we have learned about the Holocaust and the importance of preserving both its history and the memory of those who were murdered.

It is so important that, as young people—and especially as the trust's ambassadors—we continue to encourage our peers and the wider community to learn about and remember the Holocaust, because it is a reminder of the destruction that mankind is capable of. It is crucial

that the Holocaust is never forgotten so that it can never be repeated.

The theme of Holocaust memorial day this year is "Ordinary People". The theme encourages us to think of those who died and those who survived as people just like us. We need to study both the fate of those who were murdered during the Holocaust and their lives before they were victims in order to keep their memories alive and demonstrate the diversity that was lost.

Thank you so much for inviting us to lead time for reflection and to share our experience and reflections on why Holocaust education is so important for young people. [Applause.]

Prestwick Airport (Funding)

1. **Brian Whittle (South Scotland) (Con):** To ask the Scotlish Government what its response is to reported comments by the Auditor General for Scotland suggesting that Prestwick airport will continue to require millions of pounds in continued public funding while it remains in public ownership. (S6T-01128)

The Minister for Business, Trade, Tourism and Enterprise (Ivan McKee): No loan funding has been provided to Prestwick airport since 2019. The budget makes no provision for additional loan funding, as we do not envisage any being required in 2023-24.

Brian Whittle: I thank the minister for that answer. When the Scottish Government bought Prestwick airport in 2013, it was right to do so. It was a necessary step to protect a valuable national asset and sustain thousands of jobs in the local economy.

Since then, the airport has received loans totalling more than £43 million, of which £31 million has already been written off. In the Auditor General's evidence to the Public Audit Committee last week, he said that he expected that the millions of pounds being spent every year to sustain the airport would continue for as long as it remained in public hands. Does the minister believe that that is sustainable for the airport or the public finances?

Ivan McKee: To be honest, I am not sure on what basis the Auditor General made that statement because, for the past three years, the business at Prestwick airport has been profitable. As I said, we have no indication that any further additional funding will be required in this financial year, and we expect that profitable position to continue into the future.

Brian Whittle: I think that we agree that Prestwick airport has immense potential as a base for Scotland's growing space sector, a cargo hub, a research space and even an aircraft recycling facility. However, to achieve those goals requires investment far beyond what the Scottish Government can possibly commit. The airport needs and deserves substantial private sector investment to secure its future, create jobs and grow the local economy. Given the Scottish Government's unenviable record of overpromising and underdelivering with other public sector buyouts, does the minister accept that the greatest value for taxpayers and Scotland's economy from Prestwick airport can be achieved by returning it to

the private sector and not leaving it relying indefinitely on public sector-funded life support?

Ivan McKee: I agree that the airport should return to the private sector when we have a buyer that can purchase the airport with a solid business plan and can fund investment as required.

I am glad that the member acknowledges that we were correct to buy the airport back in 2013. He will know that, at that time, the airport was losing money. It is a matter of record that the Scottish Government put in funds up to 2018 but, as I said, since 2019, the business has been profitable and the Government has not put in any more funds. We expect that to be the situation going forward now that the business is back to profitability, with a significant increase in turnover over that period.

As I say, we are interested to hear from any prospective buyer and to have a conversation about the future of the airport because, as the member rightly identifies, the future of the airport will be in private sector hands.

It is worth noting that, during the Auditor General's recent appearance at the Public Audit Committee, he commented:

"We have not formed an overall value-for-money judgment on the investment in Prestwick airport."

I know that he made an overarching comment about public sector interventions, but that is what he had to say on our intervention on Prestwick airport specifically.

Siobhian Brown (Ayr) (SNP): I am grateful that the Scottish Government saved Prestwick airport in 2013. Over the past decade, more than 4,000 jobs have been supported in the surrounding area, and global companies have been attracted to base themselves at Prestwick, as one of the leading aerospace hubs. The airport was also an integral part of the £80 million Ayrshire growth deal. Although the Government still seeks a buyer for the airport, does the minister agree that it is really important that any such buyer supports the long-term economic vision for the area?

Ivan McKee: I think that the member is absolutely right. She correctly identifies the value of the aerospace and space cluster around the airport, which all members who represent the area recognise. The value of the Mangata Networks inward investment that was recently announced, which involves almost 600 high-paying jobs, is testament to that. Other investments from private sector businesses are taking place around that cluster, which is hugely important.

It is important that the future of the airport is considered in the round with our aspirations for Ayrshire and for Scotland as a whole in the aerospace and space sectors. Willie Rennie (North East Fife) (LD): I am a bit puzzled about what the minister is saying about the Auditor General. The minister seems to be in conflict with what the Auditor General has said. Will he clear that up? What discussions has he had with the Auditor General to resolve that difference of opinion, and can he explain why it has come about?

Ivan McKee: I have not had any conversations with the Auditor General. I had a look at his appearance at the Public Audit Committee just before I came down to the chamber, and I have looked at the numbers on Prestwick airport. I can state the facts, which are that no money has been put in since 2019. The business has been profitable for the past three years, and it continues to be profitable. We have no expectation that that will change this year. Therefore, as I said, I am not clear about the basis on which the Auditor General made the comment that millions of pounds are still being used to support the airport on an annual basis.

Education (Extremist Online Misogyny)

2. Katy Clark (West Scotland) (Lab): To ask the Scottish Government what steps it is taking to ensure teachers are equipped to discuss and address the issue of extremist online misogyny with pupils. (S6T-01111)

The Cabinet Secretary for Education and Skills (Shirley-Anne Somerville): We are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive high-quality education on relationships, sexual health and parenthood, which includes recognition and rejection of misogyny. Through curriculum for excellence, young people should experience factual and objective learning that enables them to make informed decisions and choices that promote and protect their own and others' wellbeing.

Learning is supported through provision of updated resources, including the RSHP online resources, and will be further supported through our established work on personal and social education and on gender-based violence in schools. That work contributes to the delivery of the equally safe strategy, which is Scotland's strategy for preventing and eradicating violence against women and girls.

Katy Clark: The Educational Institute of Scotland union has issued guidance to teachers who are looking to tackle the harmful effects of online misogyny on young people, as some misogynists continue to gain popularity on online platforms. Will the Government make further resources available to ensure that all teachers have access to equality and diversity training that explicitly includes content on gender equality and

tackling misogyny, and which addresses violence against women and girls?

Shirley-Anne Somerville: I welcome the ongoing commitment and work by the EIS and other unions on this important issue. I hope that I can reassure Katy Clark, in as much as we already have resources available to assist teachers. One resource—www.rshp.scot—contains lesson plans, activity resources and information for parents and carers to help them to reinforce the messages at home. As the member would expect, that is available in a fashion that is age appropriate for a child's education.

We are, of course, considering what more needs to be done. There has been the review of personal and social education, which made recommendations about what more could be done. Good progress is being made on delivering those recommendations. However, I agree with the member that there is absolutely no room for complacency on the issue. Misogyny is a societal problem. As schools are part of our society, it is important that they play a role in ensuring that young women and men receive the types of support and learning that they should have to allow them—as I said in my original answer—to make informed and educated decisions.

Katy Clark: The cabinet secretary will be aware of the specific problems in schools; I am sure that she will agree that teachers have an important role to play in addressing the issues. The EIS is calling for development of more specific anti-sexism learning in the curriculum and for issues such as misogyny to be explored through existing subjects. Will the cabinet secretary look at updating curriculum for excellence so that it includes across all subjects specific aims around tackling misogyny and promoting gender equality in schools?

Shirley-Anne Somerville: I am happy to look at any or all suggestions on the issue, whether they come directly from Katy Clark, the EIS or other members and stakeholders. Clearly, in Scotland we do not have a national curriculum, so it is up to schools to decide what resources they use. However, we all have to work together to ensure that staff are supported and have the best and most up-to-date resources in front of them. Given that it is an online space, in particular, that we are talking about, there is a real obligation on us to keep up to date with developments.

I am happy to look at that. Obviously, I already chair a task force that is looking at what can be done especially in this area, and in many more besides. The unions are involved in that—in particular, the EIS. I am happy to look at further suggestions on what could be done, and to see whether there are gaps in provision and whether updates need to be done.

Brian Whittle (South Scotland) (Con): Social media mean that such abuse can follow pupils home. Does the cabinet secretary agree that mental health support is crucial in tackling the effects of such abuse? If so, what is the Scottish Government doing to ensure that that support is available for all?

Shirley-Anne Somerville: Brian Whittle has raised a really important aspect of the issue, which has changed markedly since any of us were at school. That is the ability for bullying, harassment, sexual harassment and misogyny to follow a person, or young girl, home from school. When it comes to mental health in particular, he will be aware of the counsellors in our secondary schools, for which we have provided funding to local government. They are in place and play an important role. Obviously, there is also wider support through child and adolescent mental health services.

However, it is very important that we have an environment that supports not just mental health but overall wellbeing. There must also be provision in schools to ensure that young women and girls feel supported and able to come forward to report issues that they are having in schools, and that they have the absolute belief that action will be taken on that.

As I said to Katy Clark, I am more than happy to receive suggestions on this issue in particular, which I hope is something on which we can come together. I am very happy to work across the parties on the matter.

The Presiding Officer: We will pause briefly as we wait for those involved in the stage 3 proceedings to take their places. I remind members that all business follows on—although there are timings, they are estimates and we expect members to be here for the next item of business if they are involved in that item.

Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill: Stage 3

The Presiding Officer (Alison Johnstone): The next item of business is stage 3 proceedings on the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill. In dealing with the amendments, members should have with them the bill as amended at stage 2—SP Bill 12A—the marshalled list and the groupings of amendments. The division bell will sound and proceedings will be suspended for five minutes for the first division of the afternoon. The period of voting for that first division will be 45 seconds. Thereafter, I will allow a voting period of one minute for the first division after a debate.

Members who wish to speak in the debate on any group of amendments should press their request-to-speak buttons or enter RTS in the chat as soon as possible after I call the group.

Members should now refer to the marshalled list of amendments.

Section 1—Offence of hunting a wild mammal using a dog

The Presiding Officer: Group 1 is on exception for use of dogs below ground. Amendment 19, in the name of Ariane Burgess, is grouped with amendments 25, 28, 31, 54, 55, 5 to 8, 58 and 59.

Ariane Burgess (Highlands and Islands) (Green): Thank you, Presiding Officer. Please accept my apologies for being late for the start of the debate.

The Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee expressed concern about the use of even one dog underground. The committee said:

"It is not clear ... that the use of dogs at all below ground is compatible with the Bill's pursuit of the highest possible animal welfare standards."

Amendment 59, in my name, would remove section 5, which provides for an exception to allow the use of a dog to hunt foxes below ground. I thank Colin Smyth for supporting amendment 59 and all the amendments in my name in this group.

During the evidence process, the committee received evidence from the Scottish Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals on the consequences of sending dogs underground to flush foxes. We were shown pictures of dogs and foxes with horrific injuries and disfigured faces. We received written evidence about wild animals

"screaming in terror and pain as they were torn apart by dogs".

How is that compatible with the bill's pursuit of the highest standards of animal welfare? Sanctioning the use of a terrier below ground is sanctioning a core part, and perhaps the cruellest part, of fox hunting.

Terrier work continues to occur as a cruel, stand-alone pastime for people and gangs who enjoy using terriers to attack foxes and badgers. Dog fighting is illegal in Scotland. It should also be illegal to pit a dog against a fox underground. The removal of section 5 would also help to put a stop to illegal badger baiting, by removing a common excuse that baiters give, that is, that they were just trying to flush a fox.

Amendments 19, 25, 28 and 31 are consequential to amendment 59.

On the other amendments in the group, I support amendment 54, in Colin Smyth's name, which stipulates that if a dog is used to flush a fox from below ground with the intention of killing it, the fox must be killed

"by shooting it as soon as reasonably possible",

so that it is not killed by the dog or by another inhumane method.

I do not support amendment 55, in Rachael Hamilton's name, which would add to the list of purposes that justify the use of dogs underground. Nor do I support her amendment 58, which would allow the use of nets, which could prevent a fox from emerging from below ground and could trap a fox to be used as bait for young terriers.

I support amendments 5 to 8, in the name of the minister, which will add conditions to the use of a dog below ground, to reduce the impact on the welfare of dogs on foxes, but I would prefer, of course, that we did not allow hunting below ground at all.

I move amendment 19.

The Presiding Officer: I call Colin Smyth to speak to amendment 54 and other amendments in the group.

Colin Smyth (South Scotland) (Lab): Labour does not support the use of dogs below ground to control mammals, in any circumstances.

As Ariane Burgess said, the RAINE committee said, in its stage 1 report:

"It is not clear ... that the use of dogs at all below ground is compatible with the Bill's pursuit of the highest possible animal welfare standards."

That is because it is not compatible. The proposal in the bill to limit to one the number of dogs to be used underground is an ineffective compromise. If it is cruel to use more than one dog below ground, it is cruel to use one dog.

It is not credible to argue that a dog can be properly controlled once it is below ground. The Government knows and admits this. It changed the explanatory notes on the bill to say that a person who is responsible for a dog, as defined in section 2(6), no longer needs "continuously" to

"direct the dog's activity by physical contact or verbal or audible command".

Labour supports Ariane Burgess's amendments 19, 25, 28, 31 and 59, which would remove the exception completely. The risk of harm that is created by a dog encountering a wild mammal in an enclosed space is such that it is clear that section 5 should be removed on animal welfare grounds.

Amendment 54, in my name, would become relevant only if section 5 is not removed. It seeks to specify that the intention should be to kill, by shooting, the animal that emerges from below ground, to ensure that less humane methods are not used, that such a scenario is not used as a cover story and that the intention is not to kill wild mammals with dogs. Although the method of killing the wild mammal is specified, amendment 54 would more explicitly require that there could be no intention for the dog to kill the wild mammal.

I have altered the wording that I used in a similar amendment at stage 2, to clarify that the wild mammal should be shot

"as soon as reasonably possible".

The proposed wording is similar to wording that is used elsewhere in the bill.

Amendments 5 and 6, in the name of the minister, will require a dog that is used below ground to be fitted with a tracking device. Amendment 7 will require "reasonable steps" to be taken to prevent a dog from becoming trapped below ground and to ensure that a dog that is trapped is rescued as soon as possible. Labour will support those amendments. Although, as I said, we oppose the use of dogs below ground altogether, the amendments would mitigate some of the risk to dogs' welfare in such circumstances.

We support amendment 8 from the minister, which will create a condition that a fox cannot be prevented from emerging from below ground. That would mitigate one of the many risks posed to foxes by the activity permitted by section 5, should that section remain in the bill.

However, amendment 58, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, which creates similar conditions to those in amendments 5 to 8, would allow the use of nets to prevent foxes emerging from below ground. We do not support that amendment, due to the welfare concerns that it raises.

I therefore urge members to support the amendments in my name and those from Ariane Burgess and from the minister.

The Presiding Officer: I call Rachael Hamilton to speak to amendment 55 and other amendments in the group.

Rachael Hamilton (Ettrick, Roxburgh and Berwickshire) (Con): Amendment 55 in my name seeks to extend the ability to use dogs to hunt—[Interruption.]

Pardon? I do not know if someone wants to intervene

The Presiding Officer: I could hear another sound too, Ms Hamilton. Please continue.

Rachael Hamilton: Amendment 55 in my name seeks to extend the ability to use dogs to hunt wild mammals below ground, in order to preserve or protect the diversity of animal and plant species and to eradicate invasive and non-native species from certain areas. The purpose of allowing the use of a dog below ground is to enable fox control and effective wildlife management. Limiting the means to do so to the protection of livestock alone ignores the reality that using dogs below ground for those purposes is a vital tool in protecting other wildlife, such as vulnerable ground-nesting birds.

So far, we have heard no reasonable explanation as to why the Scottish Government believes that the use of dogs to control predators below ground is acceptable for the protection of livestock but not for the protection of dwindling populations of curlew or capercaillie. The importance of using dogs in those circumstances below ground is clearly outlined by Lord Bonomy and Lord Burns in the Bonomy review. Lord Bonomy said that

"the material presented to the Review is persuasive of the need for the use of terriers to ensure the despatch of a fox gone to ground"

and that

"there is no firm scientific evidence of the extent of the impact on the fox. Indeed it was observed in the Burns Report that the banning of hunting could have an adverse effect on the welfare of foxes in upland areas unless dogs could be used at least to flush foxes from cover."

The Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002, which this bill has been brought to Parliament to replace, rightly allows for that form of predator control. I ask the minister if she believes that it is appropriate, at a time when ecologists are discussing the extinction of capercaillie from Scotland, to remove a vital means of protecting those birds from predators, or if she believes that it is important to support my amendments. Any omission of that exemption by way of a vote against amendment 55 might well be the nail in the coffin for the capercaillie, but a vote

for the amendment would be a proactive step in ensuring that we do not erode the toolkit used by countryside custodians in effectively managing our wildlife.

Amendment 58 aims to outline measures that should be taken for the welfare of dogs being used below ground. Although the bill seeks to address issues in the 2002 act—as identified by the Scottish Government—that relate to animals being hunted, it also provides the opportunity to introduce measures to safeguard the welfare of dogs deployed in those activities, particularly when dogs are used below ground. By requiring the use of locating equipment and making it clear that nothing other than netting should be used to prevent an animal coming out from below ground, the amendment would protect dogs' welfare and would ensure best practice.

The Conservatives will not support the amendments in this group from Ariane Burgess and Colin Smyth, but we are minded to support the amendments from the minister.

The Presiding Officer: I call the minister to speak to amendment 5 and other amendments in the group.

The Minister for Environment and Land Reform (Màiri McAllan): I will begin with amendments 19, 25, 28, 31 and 59, in the name of Ariane Burgess, which seek to remove section 5, and the provision for using dogs below ground, from the bill.

In developing the bill, my officials and I have sought to pursue the highest possible welfare provisions while balancing that with the need for farmers, land managers and environmental groups to carry out legitimate wildlife management in our rural nation.

I know that the use of dogs below ground is a polarising issue and therefore understand why Ariane Burgess has lodged the amendments. I, too, have heard evidence about the use of dogs below ground and about how that can pose a risk to the welfare of both dogs and wild mammals.

I have sought to respond to that in many ways. That is why this bill seeks to change the law so that no more than one dog can be used below ground, which is in line with comments made by Lord Bonomy.

It is also why we are placing strict limits on the purposes for which a dog may be sent below ground. It is why I supported amendments at stage 2 to remove mink, thereby again narrowing the situations in which dogs may be used below ground, and it is why I lodged amendments 5 to 8, which we are discussing today. They seek to add further provisions to ensure that there will be best practice on welfare.

I want the provisions on the matter to be drawn as narrowly as possible. On the other hand, in the work that I and my officials and colleagues have undertaken in developing the bill, it has not been clear that there is a viable alternative when it comes purely to fox control. No more humane methods have been put to me that would fulfil the same function. In fact, something that has preyed on my mind significantly is that it has been put to me that some less humane methods could be used in the absence of an opportunity to put a dog underground. They include blocking up a den, resulting in starvation, which is something that everybody would want to avoid. After giving a great deal of thought to the matter, I am therefore unable to support Ariane Burgess's amendments, which would remove the provision.

Colin Smyth's amendment 54 would require that a person who used section 5 intended to kill the wild mammal

"by shooting it as soon as reasonably possible".

I appreciate that he has changed a similar stage 2 amendment to seek to remove inconsistent language. However, amendment 54 still presents a legislative anomaly. First, because intention is very difficult to prove, it would open up a subjectivity that was problematic under the previous act and that we must try to avoid. Moreover, there is a practical problem, because it is possible that a person will search for a wild mammal below ground but that it will not emerge, so the person cannot shoot it. The person may have intended to shoot it, as per Colin Smyth's amendment, but that will not always materialise or happen in practice. It would be wrong to have legislative provision that did not acknowledge that.

In any case, section 5(3)(d) of the bill states that,

"if the fox ... is found or emerges from below ground",

it must be

"shot dead, or killed by a bird of prey, as soon as reasonably possible".

I think that that provides much of what I suspect Colin Smyth is seeking to do, but it does it in a realistic way that takes account of changing circumstances. For those reasons, I cannot support Colin Smyth's amendment 54.

Rachael Hamilton's amendment 55 seeks to expand the number of purposes for which a dog may be used below ground to include provisions for environmental benefit. As I said in the context of Ariane Burgess's amendments, I have considered the issue very carefully and sought to strike a careful balance. Because of that, just as I could not support Ariane Burgess's amendment to remove section 5 completely, I cannot support

Rachael Hamilton's amendment 55, which would extend the purposes for which dogs may be used underground.

I have not heard any evidence on allowing the use of dogs below ground for the purposes that are listed in the environmental benefits section. I listened to what Rachael Hamilton said, but I do not think that the section that she quoted from Lord Bonomy's report is necessarily evidence of that. Moreover, the 2002 act, which we are of course seeking to update and improve, does not allow the use of dogs below ground for the purposes that Rachael Hamilton would suggest. If I was to accept her amendment, I would be going even further than what is provided under the 2002 act. I do not wish to do that, so I cannot support amendment 55.

I turn to my amendments 5 to 8. I referred to them earlier. They seek to bolster and make very clear in the bill the welfare provisions that must apply to the use of any dog underground. They provide that anyone who uses a dog to search for a fox or flush it from below ground must, as well as complying with all other conditions, take "reasonable steps" to prevent the dog from becoming trapped, fit it with a suitable tracking device and not take any steps to prevent it

"from being flushed or emerging from below ground".

Again, this is about my desire to draw the provisions as narrowly as possible and ensure the welfare of the animal as far as possible.

Rachael Hamilton's amendment 58 seeks to address many of the same issues as my amendments 5 to 8. They are similar precisely because I agreed with Rachael Hamilton's stage 2 amendment and confirmed that I would bring something back at stage 3 that addressed it. The amendments are similar, but I ask Parliament to support the wording of my amendments, which is more precise and is consistent with the rest of the bill

For example, my amendment 6 refers to

"a device to allow tracking of the position of the dog below ground",

whereas Rachael Hamilton's amendment 58 refers to

"suitable electronic locating equipment",

which is clearly subjective. Our amendments are similar, but mine are more precise, and I would be grateful if Parliament would support them.

Edward Mountain (Highlands and Islands) (Con): I remind the Parliament that I have an interest, in that I own and manage land and have been involved in wildlife management for more than 40 years.

I thank the minister for listening to some of the debates around the bill. I know that, in some of those, she has struggled to find a solution to some of the problems that she feels as a matter of conscience. However, her amendments are refreshing, because they take into account what is, after all, the good practice that is practised on the land by most people who are using dogs underground.

I am disappointed with Ariane Burgess's amendment, because she seems to seek to defend it by suggesting that it will stop dog fighting and badger baiting. There is never any excuse for dog fighting, and never any excuse for badger baiting. The badger is one of the most protected animals in the United Kingdom and the offences for interfering with or causing injury to badgers are probably some of the most stringent offences that someone can be charged with. I therefore do not find those arguments compelling, or a reason to stop the use of dogs underground.

Those people who work in the countryside know that, when a fox gets a taste for lambs, it becomes a very difficult animal to control. Often, as we heard during the committee debate from Jim Fairlie, older foxes with fewer teeth become more susceptible to predation on lambs. If members have seen a few lambs with their back passages eaten out, tongues chewed out, or soft underbellies ripped apart while they are still alive, they will know why foxes need to be controlled. Therefore, controlling them underground, by using dogs to flush them from under the ground to be shot, is entirely appropriate and is necessary across the farming community.

Colin Smyth's amendment 54 does not need supporting, because, as the minister has pointed out, that is what people are attempting to do when they flush a fox from underground: to shoot and kill it

I support Rachael Hamilton's amendments 55 and 58 because they are good practice.

I am concerned that, if members decide to support Ariane Burgess's amendments to remove section 5, we will make a problem for ourselves that will prevent us not only from looking after domestic livestock but from looking after the flora and fauna of Scotland.

Finlay Carson (Galloway and West Dumfries) (Con): I rise in support of Rachael Hamilton's amendments 55 and 58. I appreciate that the minister acknowledges the need for using dogs underground. Her amendment on that matter would improve the bill slightly on that front. However, Rachael Hamilton's amendments are based fundamentally on stakeholder engagement with the Scottish Countryside Alliance, the British Association for Shooting and Conservation and

the Kennel Club, whereas the minister's seem to be based on what her Government thinks is best.

Jim Fairlie (Perthshire South and Kinrossshire) (SNP): Will the member take an intervention?

Finlay Carson: I therefore ask the minister to reflect on who is best placed to decide on those improvements, rather than on welfare concerns over dogs.

The Presiding Officer: Is the member taking an intervention?

Finlay Carson: No.

The Presiding Officer: I call Ariane Burgess to wind up and to press or withdraw amendment 19.

Ariane Burgess: I fully understand and sympathise with farmers' need to protect their livestock and crops. Removing section 5 will not prevent farmers from doing that; it just means that they have to use another method that is less likely to result in agony and injuries for the dog and for any wild animals involved. In its report, the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee has expressed its concern about using even one dog underground, as have several welfare organisations and the Government's Scottish animal welfare commission. It is clear that the exception should be removed from the bill.

The minister has stated her concern that removing the exception for foxes could lead to an increase in other cruel practices. However, we should not shy away from outlawing cruel practices for fear of the adoption of other cruel practices. The mentality should not be, "What is the least worst?" We should turn that on its head and actively seek what is better.

I turn to Rachael Hamilton's point on the need to protect capercaillie. The Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee heard from the RSPB that it has

"limited evidence that fox and crow control benefits capercaillie".

and that it explores

"all non-lethal options before moving to lethal control."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 8 June 2022; c 38, 40.]

It always brings in trained marksmen to conduct fox control on its land and it does not use dogs to control foxes.

In response to Edward Mountain, I say that if badgers are so well protected, why does Scottish Badgers advocate removing exceptions to the use of dogs below ground?

I press amendment 19.

The Presiding Officer: The question is, that amendment 19 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

Members: No.

The Presiding Officer: There will be a division. As this is the first division of this stage, I will suspend for around 5 minutes to allow members to access the digital voting system.

The Presiding Officer: The result of the division is: For 24, Against 96, Abstentions 0.

Amendment 19 disagreed to.

The Presiding Officer: We move to group 2, which is on field sports. Amendment 20, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, is grouped with amendments 21, 26, 27, 29, 30, 32, 33, 60, and 63 to 68. I point out that, if amendment 64 is agreed to, I cannot call amendment 65 because of preemption.

Rachael Hamilton: Amendments 20, 21 and the other amendments in my name seek to allow exceptions for rough shooting and field trials. Throughout the passage of the bill, we have heard a strong and sustained case for those two activities to be exempted from the two-dog limit, in the light of the inclusion of rabbits in the bill. At the heart of the proposed exemptions is the right for people to continue lawful and legitimate activities that effectively manage wildlife and ensure that pests are controlled humanely. I do not use the word "pests" in the lightest sense, in that description.

There has, throughout the process, been a lack of evidence to show that using two or more dogs during a rough shoot has any impact on the welfare of rabbits or foxes. We know that gun dogs do not operate in packs—that argument has been made many times throughout the bill's passage—nor do they chase wild mammals. The process of flushing and humanely dispatching wild mammals is done effectively, efficiently and with the highest regard for the highest animal welfare standards.

The amendments in my name reflect the minister's wording in correspondence with the RAINE Committee. To put it simply, if an exception is not accepted, rough shooters will find themselves falling foul of the bill, which creates a grey area around rough shooting. Whether in relation to the implementation of the ethical principles in wildlife management, a possible snaring ban or the limiting of hunting and rough shooting to two dogs, it is an important argument

to make and we should consider the matter with an evidence-based approach to wildlife management.

My amendments in the group offer a way round that that could help to strike the right balance within the bill. Amendments 63, 65 and 66 would remove references to sports from section 6. Those references in that section completely and deliberately misunderstand the nature of hunting, reinforce the impression that landmanagement activities such as deer stalking or game shooting are only about sport. However, we know that they play a vital role in relation to harvesting of food, pest control and wildlife management in general. That evidence was set out as clear as day to the RAINE Committee by stakeholders including the NFU Scotland, the British Association for Shooting and Conservation, the Scottish Countryside Alliance and Scottish Estates. However, the Government has chosen all along to listen but, ultimately, to ignore the evidence.

The argument that was advanced 20 years ago by the opponents of hunting was that they had no problem with dogs being used for pest control—using a pack to flush to guns—but wanted to end what they called "hunting for sport". It is unhelpful, unnecessary and misleading to reduce those activities to the single purpose of sport when, in reality, they are undertaken for a variety of purposes. Moreover, those purposes are essential to Scotland's food security and biodiversity.

Colin Smyth's amendments 60 and 64, which seek to remove exceptions for falconry, would treat falconry solely as a sport. For the reasons that I have set out above, that notion should be removed from the bill. As my colleague Edward Mountain said at stage 2, we need look no further than the roof of the chamber in which we sit, where falcons are used to keep pigeons out of gutters, for an example of use of falcons that does not relate to sport. Although that does not involve mammals, there are examples in which falcons are used to control predators that have been searched for or flushed from cover by dogs.

I tried to intervene on Ariane Burgess to help her, as she perhaps bent the truth in one of her statements in the debate on the previous group of amendments. One of the primary drivers of population decline of capercaillie, among other ground-nesting birds, is predation by foxes. That is stated by NatureScot on its website. I give Ariane Burgess the opportunity to correct her statement on that point for the record.

I move amendment 20.

Colin Smyth: Amendments 60 and 64 in my name would remove providing quarry for falconry as a permitted use of dogs.

Falconry creates welfare concerns for both the bird of prey and the animal that is being hunted. The RAINE Committee questioned the inclusion of falconry in its stage 1 report, commenting that it required more information as to

"why an exception for falconry has been included in the scope of the bill."

It also raised concerns about section 6(2)(e), which requires that

"the wild mammal which is being searched for, stalked or flushed is shot dead, or killed by a bird of prey".

I lodged an amendment at stage 2 that the minister said she could not support because it would ban by the back door an otherwise lawful activity, given that because there had been no consultation on a proposal to ban falconers from hunting, falconry does not fall within what it is intended would be covered by the bill. However, the issue was widely discussed; evidence was heard at stage 1, otherwise it would not have featured in the committee's stage 1 report. To say that there should be no action against something that is clearly cruel because it was not included in the first draft of the bill is not a strong argument.

I remind the minister that during the passage of the Animals and Wildlife (Penalties, Protections and Powers) (Scotland) Act 2020, the Government introduced amendments at stage 2 to ban shooting of seals, and subsequently supported an amendment at stage 3 to protect mountain hares. Both those amendments were welcome, although neither had been the subject of consultation by the Scottish Government when the bill was introduced. They were the right thing to do. The Government has completely failed to answer the basic question of how flushing a wild mammal to be killed by a waiting bird of prey can be considered to be less cruel than that bird being killed by a dog.

Amendments 20, 26, 29, 32 and 67, in the name of Rachael Hamilton would introduce a new exception for rough shooting, and amendments 21, 27, 30, 33 and 68 would create a new exception for gun-dog field trials. Neither of those has a two-dog limit as long as the intention is not to use the dogs as a pack. That is inconsistent with the rest of the bill and risks the creation of loopholes. However, there is legitimate concern; the bill lacks clarity in relation to rough shooting, so there is a need for far more explicit guidance on the matter.

I note that the Government has amended the explanatory notes to the bill, which state that

"under this exception several people could each use one or two dogs to flush separate wild mammals as quarry for shooting, providing they did not allow the dogs to join together"

with other groups of one or two dogs to, for example, flush out the same quarry. There are practical challenges in enforcing such measures when there are more than two dogs. I hope that the minister will say more about that for the benefit of those who carry out rough shooting and those who are concerned that loopholes could emerge.

I urge members to support the amendments in my name to remove falconry from the exceptions in the bill. I will listen carefully to what the minister has to say regarding rough shooting.

Ariane Burgess: I speak in support of Colin amendments 60 and 64. Smyth's amendments would remove the exceptions for use of up to two dogs in falconry for sport. It is true that falconry is legal in Scotland, but that does not justify the use of dogs in falconry. The bill seeks to constrain the situations in which dogs can be used to hunt wild mammals. If hunting must occur, the use of dogs should be a last resort, so why should there be an exception from the offence for sport of all purposes? We cannot allow such an exception to be another loophole for fox hunts, as is the case in England where hunts have been known to carry birds of prey as a token presence in order to circumvent the two-dog limit. I urge members to consider every exception from this point of view: could it be used as loophole?

Màiri McAllan: Amendments 20, 26, 29, 32 and 67, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, relate to rough shooting, which has been discussed at length throughout the bill process. I have listened very carefully to the arguments that have been made today, and I listened to all the contributions that were made throughout additional scrutiny of section 6, that was organised by the committee and specifically dedicated to rough shooting.

I have heard a lot of evidence about the behaviours of dogs that are involved in rough shooting. They are gun dogs. The evidence included statements that they would not chase and kill wild mammals or form packs and would always be under strict control. That is exactly what the bill will require of them; it gives me confidence that they will be able to behave in a way that complies with the provisions of the bill, should it be passed today.

As drafted, the bill allows for most permutations of rough shooting to continue, within the new rules. Although some people might need to adapt behaviours, that will usually involve a minimal change. A minimal change is justified for the sake of consistency, when set against the risk of creating new loopholes with which people would be able to take as many dogs as they like and say they are rough shooting when, in fact, they are

illegally hunting. That could besmirch the legitimate activity of rough shooting.

Equally, I could not justify creating an exemption for regulation of rough shooters, because although rough shooting is not an unimportant activity, it is largely recreational. On the other hand, I would be asking farmers to comply with a very strict two-dog limit when they need to protect their livestock, or asking environmental managers to do so when they are seeking to control invasive non-native species. It is a strength of the bill that we regulate everyone who would purport to use dogs in the course of hunting in the countryside. Of course, as I said, there is also a risk that allowing an unlimited number of dogs would create a smoke screen

For those reasons—just as I could not do so at stage 2—I cannot support amendments that would create an exception. However, I have already made the commitment that I will, if the bill is passed, work with the sector to develop guidance on rough shooting so that the sector and the public can understand what to expect in the countryside following enactment of the bill. That will meet some of what Colin Smyth has asked for.

My comments on Rachael Hamilton's amendments 21, 27, 30, 33 and 68 are similar. I do not think that an exception for field trials is necessary or justified. I spoke to stakeholders, including the Kennel Club, very recently to discuss the implications of the bill for field trials. Those discussions led me to conclude that the bill will not prevent field trials from taking place, and the Kennel Club acknowledged that. Therefore, I will not support the amendments.

My comments on Colin Smyth's amendments to remove falconry from section 6 are much the same as they were at stage 2. Falconry is a permitted activity in Scotland, and as long as it is done in accordance with all relevant legislation—for example, the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981—that will remain the case. Dogs are sometimes used in falconry to flush wild mammals into the open where they can be taken by birds of prey. It is therefore right that that comes within the scope of the bill and will be regulated, as other uses of dogs would be in the course of hunting.

Colin Smyth's amendments would remove altogether the ability of a person to use dogs. I understand why some people do not agree with hunting mammals for recreational purposes, but as things stand falconry is a lawful form of hunting, and as long as dogs are used within the requirements of the bill, it is not justifiable to single it out. For those reasons, I cannot support his amendments.

Rachael Hamilton's amendments 63, 65, and 66 would remove the reference to "sport" from the definitions of game shooting. I am conscious that there are many motivations to undertaking such activities, and during the discussion of Edward Mountain's very similar amendments on the topic at stage 2, I explained that, for example, activities such as deer stalking that are being done to protect trees would fall under section 7. If such activities are done to prevent serious damage to crops, they would fall under section 3.

The term "sport" has been included to distinguish between recreational pursuits and wildlife management and environmental purposes. It will be up to the individual to determine which of the exceptions in the bill their activity falls under. I continue to believe that the term "sport" is helpful in the context, and I do not support the amendments for that reason.

Rachael Hamilton: First, I am concerned about some of the comments that have been made during the passage of the bill by individuals who will not support my amendments. I believe rough shooting has not been defined and that the Government has struggled to explain what a rough shoot is. I also believe that rough shooting has been overlooked in the context of the bill, and that it was considered only as we approached the end of stage 2, when we had to bring together a round table in committee to hear from stakeholders who were concerned that rough shooting would be captured by the bill.

I also do not agree with a number of comments that have been made in the chamber that rough shooting could be used as a cover for any activity. To those who know how rough shooting works, there are differences between dogs that are used in different activities. For example, when we took heard from the Scottish evidence, we Gamekeepers Association that there differences between a lurcher, a spaniel and a hound, and that a working dog is under control. The minister agreed that she was confident that individuals are able to control working dogs that are trained to obey commands.

I welcome the minister's commitment to produce guidance. We came to a conclusion on that in committee during stage 2.

Finlay Carson: Does Rachael Hamilton agree that rough shooting and gun-dog field trials are important for social cohesion and to the very fabric of rural life, that they contribute to a rural economy that is worth tens of millions of pounds to remote areas, and that they bring employment throughout the Scottish countryside? Protecting and promoting those activities is imperative if we are to preserve and protect the rural way of life.

Does Rachael Hamilton also agree that Labour and the Greens have little or no understanding and that, along with the Scottish Government, the minister and her civil servants, who admitted that their knowledge of rough shooting was gained by watching YouTube videos, they absolutely miss the importance of hunting and rough shooting to the rural economy? Does she agree that some of the amendments that they have lodged, including on the inclusion of rabbits in the legislation, have been ill thought out, without any valid or substantiated animal welfare concerns having been heard?

Rachael Hamilton: I agree. Many of us in the chamber represent rural constituencies. Colin represents from Labour constituency, I represent one, and Màiri McAllan represents one. We all have individuals in our constituencies—in particular, gamekeepers—who rely on the jobs that are created by those activities. I also agree that there was a lack of evidence taking into account those aspects as the bill went through the committee stages.

In conclusion, I will not support Colin Smyth's amendments, and I urge members to support mine.

The Deputy Presiding Officer McArthur): The question is, that amendment 20 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: We move to group 3, which is on the definition of a wild mammal. Before I call the first amendment, I make a plea to those who wish to speak. Rather than simply intervening during the debate, they should press their request-to-speak buttons as soon as possible, and certainly before the final speaker gets to their feet, as that would be helpful.

Amendment 22, in the name of Edward Mountain, is grouped with amendments 23 and 24.

Edward Mountain: I rise to speak to the two amendments in my name. Amendment 22 would remove mink from the scope of the bill, and amendment 23 would remove rabbits.

I will talk first about mink, but before I do so, I remind members that when I talk about controlling both those species, I have no intention—I have never had any intention in my life—of increasing suffering in dealing with a predator or an animal that needs to be removed. That must be done in a humane way.

Let us look at mink. Mink is a non-native invasive species. For members who may not

remember this, I note that mink were introduced for mink farming, and when mink farming became no longer viable, they were released into the native, pristine environment of Scotland.

As such, mink are a danger to our flora and fauna. They are an aggressive animal, and members who have seen them operating on the banks of a stream, river or burn will have seen that they destroy birds and voles. Birds that they could destroy include ducks and important groundnesting birds such as oystercatchers, sandpipers and redshanks. We need to protect those birds. Should mink ever get into a domestic environment, they would certainly kill every chicken in a pen. It is as simple as that.

Across Scotland, it is accepted that mink are not something that we should welcome. I remind members that the Cairngorms National Park Authority had a mink eradication scheme whereby it encouraged landowners across the national park to destroy mink. It provided mink rafts and, in some cases, traps to allow them to do that. That project was supported by Scottish Natural Heritage at the time and I believe that it is still in place.

The danger of not controlling non-native invasive species was demonstrated in Orkney—as you will know, Presiding Officer—when stoats got there in 2010. It is unacceptable that we allow that to happen in those environments, and sadly there is no way of being able to eradicate stoats. Why oh why is the Parliament considering making mink more difficult to eradicate when that species is destroying our native flora and fauna?

I also want to talk about rabbits. I have a real problem with rabbits being included in the scope of the bill. I listened to the minister speak at stage 2, and she said that rabbits should be included for a couple of reasons. The first was that they could be used as a cover for hare coursing. That is absolutely not the case. Rabbits and hares are significantly different; people who live and work in the countryside know that they are different and can identify them. People who seek to use rabbits as cover for an illegal activity should really have the book thrown at them, but rabbits do not need further protection.

The minister gave another reason for rabbits needing further protection. She said that they feel pain in the same way that foxes do. However, in the same breath, she is not protecting rats in the bill, because she does not feel that they are as good as rabbits or foxes. My problem is that, in most cases, if a constituent saw a wild rabbit come into their house, they would probably usher it out, but if they saw a rat come into their house, they

would be straight on to the local council to demand that it be killed and that a rodent control officer be sent round.

Rachael Hamilton: On that point, the bill allows a dog to be used to kill a rat, but it cannot be used to kill a rabbit. Has the member heard any evidence that that is better in welfare terms?

Edward Mountain: I have heard no evidence that there is any difference. The only difference is that rats are not cuddly.

Rabbits present a real issue when it comes to land management. I am sure that I do not need to remind the minister of the expression "breeding like rabbits". One doe rabbit can produce 100 kits a year. If we multiply that number throughout the year, we can see that we are talking about a huge number of rabbits.

When I managed a Scottish site of special scientific interest in relation to wild grassland and Scottish pinewoods, we had to resort to killing more than 10,000 rabbits a year for four years to allow the habitat to recover. We needed all the legal tools that were available to us to control rabbits. We engaged in shooting the rabbits, and we used long nets, which I have mentioned to the minister. That involves using dogs to flush rabbits, when they are away from their holes, into nets before they are culled, so flushing from cover when taking on rabbits is particularly important.

The minister said that she is concerned that people will say that they were flushing rabbits as a cover when they were hunting hares. I found that to be an odd contribution, because I am sure that she knows that hares and rabbits live in very different habitats. Hares live mainly in open fields, whereas rabbits live in closed vegetation so that they can go from one hole to another and can seek protection, so they cannot really be confused.

It is important that we are not squeamish about dealing with animals that need to be removed from our habitat. I am sure that I do not need to remind members that Scottish Natural Heritage sanctioned the killing of ruddy ducks—an invasive species—which were mating with our native ducks in Scotland, and the removal of hedgehogs from Barra.

In relation to native species, work is also being done to control deer. I question some of the headlines that members will have seen about controlling deer, but it appears that deer do not need the same protection. I have seen hinds that were heavily pregnant with calves being shot by Government agencies and, in some cases, by organisations that said that they were doing that in the public interest. I question that when the animals are left where they are shot.

However, we should not be squeamish about controlling animals if we do it in the right way and format. Therefore, I ask the Parliament to allow land managers to be able to kill mink—an invasive non-native species that is destroying our flora and fauna without control—and to give its approval for the removal of rabbits from the scope of the bill, because there is no need for them to be in it, just as there is no need for rats to be in it.

I move amendment 22.

Rachael Hamilton: Amendment 24, which is in my name, would add an exemption in the bill for hunting wild rabbits. There is an established need to control rabbit populations by that means. However, I recognise that simply creating a blanket exemption would potentially provide an excuse for the illegal act of hare coursing, although I am yet to be convinced of that. By exempting rabbits, but only where the landowner's permission has been explicitly amendment 24 would prevent those who are engaged in hare poaching from being able to avoid liability by claiming to be hunting rabbits. The amendment would therefore more effectively meet the Government's policy objective and it would assist Police Scotland with enforcement—it is obviously struggling with that right now—without harming the ability of land managers to effectively and humanely control rabbits.

The bill will mean that all rabbits will have to be shot. There is no evidence to support the assumption that flushing rabbits to be swiftly dispatched by dogs is a welfare concern, and I would like to hear more from the minister on that. As my colleague Edward Mountain eloquently set out, there is a failure to understand the fundamental differences between rabbits and hares. Rabbits do not engage in long chases, unlike hares, which live permanently above ground. As Edward Mountain described, rabbits spend most of their time below ground, coming up only to graze and feed. There are fundamental differences between the two species, so I support amendment 23 by my colleague Edward Mountain.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: A couple of members wish to participate. I invite them to be relatively brief.

Colin Smyth: Amendment 22, which is in the name of Edward Mountain, would remove mink from the protection afforded by the bill, and amendments 23 and 24 would remove rabbits from that protection. I fear that those amendments could create a loophole that would allow the unlimited use of dogs to chase and kill rabbits. Control is absolutely deemed necessary in many cases, but I believe that far more humane methods are available, so Labour cannot support the amendments.

Finlay Carson: As we have heard from Rachael Hamilton, there is a failure to understand the fundamental differences between rabbit hunting and hare coursing. The facts were confirmed by the evidence of Professor Stephen Harris, a well-known opponent of hunting, in his evidence to the hunting hearing that was conducted by the Westminster Government in September 2002. In respect of the use of dogs to control rabbits, he stated:

"This process is very different from coursing hares. First, the quarry is very much smaller ... and this means that it is much easier for dogs to kill a rabbit quickly. Secondary, the distance over which the hunt occurs is much shorter; rabbits and hares are spatially separated, with hares remaining in the middle of open spaces, rabbits the edges of fields. Hares try to escape by outrunning their prey; they have no natural predators that chase them over long distances. Rabbits, in comparison, do not normally move more than 10 metres from cover, and their means of escape is a short dash to their warren. So the pursuit is extremely short".

He went on:

"Whilst the aim of rabbiting with dogs is primarily pest control (as opposed to hare hunting, which is solely sport), it probably makes an extremely small (if any) contribution to population control. The vast majority of rabbits are killed by ferreting, gassing and shooting, and it is unlikely that rabbiting is less humane than any of these forms of control."

The evidence clearly shows that, in terms of welfare and the necessary control of rabbits, the Scottish Parliament was right to exclude rabbits from the scope of the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002. The assumption that shooting rabbits is somehow better in welfare terms than the use of dogs is simply wrong. Flushing and dispatching rabbits with dogs is effective and humane.

The second argument that is advanced in favour of including rabbits in the bill is that the measure will prevent rabbit control from being used as an excuse for illegal hare poaching, which is commonly known as hare coursing. That is desirable, but it could be achieved by recognising that trespass is the primary ingredient of the offence where the activity occurs on land without its owner's permission, and by exempting rabbits, but only where the landowner's permission has been explicitly obtained. I believe that the amendments that have been made to the bill are lazy ones, and that we should look at other alternatives rather than including rabbits solely to prevent hare coursing.

Màiri McAllan: The definition of "wild mammal" that is used in the bill was discussed extensively during stages 1 and 2. When amendments similar to the ones in this group were lodged at stage 2, I made it clear that I could not support any amendment that sought to exclude rabbits, mink or any other wild animal from the definition and

therefore from the protections that they are afforded under the bill.

The majority of RAINE Committee members were of the same view as me and the amendments were defeated at stage 2 by seven votes to two. I have not changed my opinion in the intervening period and I will not be supporting either Rachael Hamilton's or Edward Mountain's amendments today. I am happy to say just a very quick word, with reference to both mink and rabbit, as to why that is.

Removing mink from the scope of the bill would allow them to be chased and killed by dogs. There is no rationale for that and doing so would, I think, certainly have negative welfare implications. It is worth pointing out that mink can still be controlled under the bill, for many of the reasons that Edward Mountain set out, including if they require to be controlled as part of an invasive non-native species scheme. We heard during stage 2 that mink can be effectively managed by other means such as trapping. I ask Parliament to note that mink are currently included within the definition of wild mammal under the 2002 act. That means that it is currently illegal to chase and kill them and that Edward Mountain's amendments would therefore represent a step backwards. I want to move forwards, so I will not be supporting the amendments.

Equally, on rabbits, the policy rationale for including them within the definition of wild mammal has been set out clearly in the process of the bill and it has been rehearsed by some members today. I have spoken at length about why rabbits have been included. It is for two reasons: first, to close the loophole whereby persons who seek to engage in hare coursing were claiming that they were hunting rabbits and, secondly, for animal welfare reasons.

Finlay Carson: The minister may remember that, during our evidence session, Detective Sergeant Telford told the committee:

"That is a difficult one"

with regard to rough shooting. He went on:

"That is where intent would come into it, and it might be difficult to differentiate. That opportunity is always going to be there, if dogs are flushing game legally but encounter a mammal and chase it. That risk is there. I do not know whether that is necessarily addressed by the bill."

Further, when pressed on the possibility of reports of illegal hunting to the police in connection with shoots involving dogs, DS Telford replied:

"We will not know until the new regime is introduced."— [Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 22 June 2022; c 14.]

Is that a good way to introduce new laws?

Màiri McAllan: I was listening very carefully, but I am struggling to attribute what Finlay Carson has quoted to the issue of rabbits and hare coursing. Rough shooting was the subject of a previous group, but I take it that all those things are connected. Since Finlay Carson mentions DS Telford, let me point to something that he said in the course of our discussion about rabbits. He said:

"Police Scotland welcomes the inclusion of rabbits, because it would, to an extent, negate the excuse that the dogs were hunting rabbits rather than hares."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 22 June 2022; c 6.]

He went on to say, at stage 2:

"In relation to the enforcement of hare coursing offences, the addition of rabbits would aid police investigations."

Rachael Hamilton asked:

"Is that based on evidence?"

DS Telford replied:

"I would say that it is."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 23 November 2022; c 35.]

For those reasons—because it is important for the welfare of rabbits, which are sentient beings like hares, and to seek to overcome the excuse for hare coursing—I cannot support the removal of those species from the definition of wild mammal.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I invite Mr Mountain to wind up and to press or withdraw amendment 22.

Edward Mountain: I will keep my comments short. I am sorry that we are moving on without considering the real issue here, which is, as I think we all accept, that mink, as a non-native invasive species, is a real challenge to Scotland's flora and fauna. By passing this bill, we are going to limit the control of that species, which I think is against Scotland's interests. It is certainly against the interests of some of the iconic species.

If I may just point something out, I know that Ariane Burgess mentioned earlier that foxes do not predate capercaillie and that the RSPB said that that was not the case. I would respectfully suggest that they do in the same way that mink do. If Ms Burgess needs evidence of that, there was a period of two years when the RSPB did not control foxes on Abernethy, and then it went back to controlling them because they do predate. Mink are the same problem as foxes and they need to be controlled. We should not be limiting that.

I understand the minister's reluctance to remove rabbits, based on the fact that she thinks that people will misidentify them. I say, as a countryman, that I have thought that the only time when rabbits were misconstrued as hares, or hares were misconstrued as rabbits, was when

people were watching Bugs Bunny, because clearly—

Jim Fairlie: Will the member take an intervention?

Edward Mountain: Yes, I will, after I finish my point. Clearly, as we all know, Bugs Bunny is not a bunny but a hare.

Jim Fairlie: I thank Edward Mountain for bringing a wee bit of humour to the debate.

Does the member recognise that the bill is not about people who are carrying out legitimate activity but about people who are trying to break the law? The latter know the difference between a rabbit and a hare, but they are using that as a cover.

Edward Mountain: That is an extremely weak argument. If you are changing the law—[Interruption.] Sorry, but it is very difficult to give you an answer to the question if you are talking at the same time as I am, because you cannot possibly be listening to it.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Please speak through the chair, Mr Mountain.

Edward Mountain: If you are—[*Interruption*.] Changing the law on the grounds that the existing legislation on coursing is insufficient and that the police do not have the resources or the knowledge to implement it is a weak reason if people who are abiding by the law and controlling animals that are a problem in Scotland are disadvantaged.

I will say no more because it is obvious that people have made up their minds. I think that both those species should not be within the—[Interruption.] I will close because there is little possibility that I will get anyone to listen to me, given the barracking that is going on. [Interruption.]

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Will you confirm whether you are pressing the amendment?

Edward Mountain: I press amendment 22.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The question is, that amendment 22 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

Members: No.

Section 3—Exception: management of wild mammals above ground

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 4 is on "Exceptions: condition of killing the wild mammal". Amendment 34, in the name of Colin Smyth, is grouped with amendments 1, 35, 36, 56, 9, 57, 61, 10, 62, 11, 70, 12 and 71.

Colin Smyth: Amendments 34, 56, 61 and 70 would remove the use of a bird of prey as a permitted method of killing, as it is neither humane nor efficient and there is no more justification for its being a permitted method than there is for using dogs to kill. In its response to the RAINE Committee's consideration of the bill, the Scottish Animal Welfare Commission said that it was

"not aware of any evidence that killing by a bird of prey is more humane than killing by a dog"

and that it

"would certainly doubt that it could be more humane than competent shooting."

It is clear that the exception is not in line with the intentions of the bill, so I urge members to support my amendments to remove the practice of using a bird of prey as a method of killing wild animals.

My amendments 1, 9, and 10 to 12 would specify that dogs should not be used to kill an injured wild mammal. That would ensure that more humane methods were used to kill a wounded animal, and it would avoid the use of the scenario as a cover story if a dog was used to kill. It is crucial that we do not allow any loopholes to remain in the bill that might allow people to continue to use dogs to kill wild mammals.

I lodged amendments at stage 2 that sought to make the same changes to sections 3, 5, 6 and 7—section 6A was added to the bill at that stage. The minister offered to work with me on the wording of the amendments to ensure that the language was consistent with the rest of the bill, and I am grateful for the work that has been done to achieve that.

Finlay Carson: I have a quote:

"the weight of the evidence, as noted in the Burns Report at paragraph 6.48, is that in the vast majority of cases the time to insensibility and death in these situations is no more than a few seconds. These provisions were enacted in the knowledge of the terms of the Burns Report. No evidence has been presented ... to indicate the abuse of these provisions by using dogs to despatch seriously injured or orphaned wild mammals."

That quote comes from the Bonomy review's report, which has been used to inform the bill. Can Colin Smyth provide any evidence contrary to those findings?

Colin Smyth: I am sure that Finlay Carson would use the same argument about hunting in general. He wants to see dogs being used to kill animals, and I fundamentally disagree with him on that. Alternatives can be used that are far more humane, certainly in the case of shooting, so I disagree with him on that point.

As I said, I am grateful for the work that has been done on my amendments to section 3, particularly in relation to not allowing dogs to be used to kill injured animals.

Amendments 35, 57, 62 and 71, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, would add the caveat "in the circumstances" to the requirement to kill an injured wild mammal in a way that causes "the minimum possible suffering". The existing condition refers to "reasonable steps" being taken, so I believe the condition has already been caveated.

I urge members to support my amendments, to ensure that only the most humane methods are used to kill wild mammals and that under no circumstances are dogs used to do so.

I move amendment 34.

Rachael Hamilton: I will speak first to Colin Smyth's amendments in this group. It is, of course, important that we are all looking at the bill from the angle of animal welfare. I am envisaging an animal that has been injured. Is Colin Smyth saying that a dog handler should just allow a fox to run injured if it has gone through a line of guns? Perhaps Colin Smyth should consider that point. We will not support amendment 34, and I ask Colin Smyth to answer that question in his summing up.

Amendments 35, 57, 62 and 71, in my name, aim to address a potential problem in the existing wording, which leaves unclear what amounts to taking "reasonable steps" to use a method that causes "the minimum possible suffering". It needs to be made clear that causing "the minimum possible suffering" in the context in which the person is operating constitutes taking "reasonable steps". The addition of "in the circumstances" makes it clear that the method of minimum suffering will vary depending on circumstances. Even if there was a method that could objectively be said to cause less suffering, it might not be possible to use that method in the circumstances. The addition would also avoid arguments as to which method is, in fact, the one that causes "the minimum possible suffering".

The bill will otherwise put unreasonable expectations on those who are using dogs for the purposes of hunting wild mammals—for example, farmers protecting livestock or gamekeepers controlling populations of wild species. It is important that those people's work, which is vital to Scotland's food security and the preservation of its biodiversity, is set in its proper context

throughout the bill, and that is what my amendments seek to do.

I will support Edward Mountain's amendment 36.

Edward Mountain: I state again that we surely must all want to ensure the humane dispatch of animals, and my amendment 36 seeks to do just that. When one gets into thick cover, it is sometimes very difficult to track down a wounded animal—Mr Fairlie used that example during committee debates.

I ask the cabinet secretary about animals that have been injured. For example, it might be possible to follow a deer with a broken leg over open ground, although one would have to move quickly. However, in closed ground, where the deer could move around within, say, bracken or rhododendrons, following it would be virtually impossible using just two dogs, despite the fact that the deer would be moving on only three legs. When a deer has a broken jaw-that does happen, sometimes, because a shot has gone astray or the deer has been injured in a road traffic accident—it is virtually impossible for two dogs to keep pace with the deer in cover. That is why I would like more dogs to be available to deal with injured animals.

That came home to me at the weekend, when I went over to Gairloch. I saw a stag on the edge of the road that had been struck by a lorry or a car. Its antler was lying on the road and it was standing on the edge of the road with a broken leg. In this case, because it was snowy and open hill, it was possible for the stalker I contacted to come out and dispatch the animal. If it had been a woodland setting, a stalker going out with two dogs could have spent days—literally days—looking for that animal. That is why I support people being given the opportunity to catch up with an injured animal and dispatch it as quickly as possible, and it is why I support not only my amendment 36 but Rachael Hamilton's amendments.

There is a misconception in Colin Smyth's amendment 34 that falconry results in the prolonged suffering of animals. I have never seen this in real life, but I know for a fact that golden eagles often hunt in the winter. They separate younger calves from their mothers and harry them until they are driven over a cliff face and killed. The eagles then eat the carrion down below. That is not what we are talking about. What we are talking about in this case, with falconry, is falcons—possibly not even native species—being used to kill an animal, which, as in most cases I have seen, is done extremely quickly and with little

suffering. I therefore cannot support Colin Smyth's amendment 34.

I ask members to remember that, if they vote against my amendment, they are possibly prolonging the suffering of an animal, which is not something that I would ever seek to do.

Ariane Burgess: I speak in support of Colin Smyth's amendments in this group. Colin's amendments 34, 56, 61 and 70 seek to remove, throughout the bill, "bird of prey" from the permitted methods of killing a wild mammal. Several stakeholders told the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee about the animal welfare impact of killing with a bird of prey. The Government's own Scottish Animal Welfare Commission stated:

"The impact on the welfare of the hunted animal is likely to be similar whether killed by a dog or a bird of prey."

Further, if a fox is the target species, there is also a risk to the bird of prey. That is why the SSPCA does not support falconry for population management, and it is why it questioned

"why birds of prey are included when the purpose is wildlife control after all other options have been exhausted."

It is also why the committee's stage 1 report states that it is

"not clear to the Committee why birds of prey are one of the two permitted methods of killing under the Bill."

I also support Colin Smyth's amendments 1, 9, 10, 11 and 12, which stipulate that, if a wild mammal is injured, a dog cannot be used to kill it. Instead, a more humane method must be used.

Conversely, I oppose Rachael Hamilton's amendment 57, which would weaken the requirement to minimise suffering when killing an injured mammal by adding "in the circumstances".

Finlay Carson: Will the member take an intervention?

Ariane Burgess: I will not take an intervention, because I was making a brief comment.

Màiri McAllan: I begin by addressing Colin Smyth's amendments 34, 56, 61 and 70, which would make it unlawful for a person to use a bird of prey to kill a wild mammal that had been searched for, stalked or flushed by dogs. As dogs play an important role in falconry, those amendments, if agreed to, would, in effect, ban certain types of falconry by the back door.

I said in relation to Colin Smyth's amendments 60 and 64 that although I appreciated that some people would like falconry to be banned, it is currently a permitted activity in Scotland, as long as it is done in accordance with relevant legislation. As we seek to come together and end illegal hunting, we must guard against our actions

impinging on otherwise lawful activity. Therefore, I cannot support those amendments.

However, Mr Smyth's amendments 1, 9 and 10 to 12 elaborate on methods of dispatch that cause the minimum possible suffering. I listened carefully to his reasons for similar proposed amendments at stage 2. I said then that, although they did not work as proposed, I would be happy to work with him to bring something back at stage 3.

I have been clear throughout the progress of the bill that the chasing and killing of a wild mammal by a dog has no place in modern Scotland. Amendments 1, 9 and 10 to 12 make that clear by stating that killing a wild mammal

"in a way that causes it the minimum possible suffering",

as required by the bill, will never allow for it to be killed by a dog or dogs. That is an important provision that goes to the heart of the bill, and I am pleased to have worked with Colin Smyth on it.

On Rachael Hamilton's amendments 35, 57, 62 and 71, the bill provides the condition that, if an attempt to kill a wild mammal

"results in it being injured but not killed, reasonable steps"

must be

"taken to kill it in a way that causes it the minimum possible suffering."

Rachael Hamilton's amendments seek to caveat that requirement by adding the words "in the circumstances".

I listened to what Rachael Hamilton said, but I remain of the view that those amendments are not necessary, and I fear that they could weaken the provision. As worded, the bill already implicitly provides that "the minimum possible suffering" might depend on the circumstances. A person can only ever act in the circumstances in which they find themselves.

Finlay Carson: When it comes to Colin Smyth's amendments on killing with a dog, what does the minister suggest should happen if a fox was shot and injured as it passed through a line of guns and took off over open ground? Should the dog handler just stand and watch the fox disappear, potentially to die an agonising death under cover, when they have the means to deal with it humanely and guickly?

I suggest that Colin Smyth and others are considering how to deal with a circumstance that might arise infrequently with regard to misuse of the legislation, but welfare issues that will arise are falling on deaf ears. That begs the question whether welfare is at the heart of the decisions that are being taken in relation to Colin Smyth's amendments.

Màiri McAllan: The key point of Finlay Carson's intervention is important. I understand that, if an animal is injured or killed, there has to be provision for it to be located and dispatched as quickly, effectively and humanely as possible. That is why, at stage 2, I introduced amendments to allow the use of two dogs to search for an injured or dead animal. What will never be acceptable and has not been legal for 20 years is to allow a dog to chase and rip apart a wild mammal, and that should remain the case.

Rachael Hamilton: Will the minister clarify whether, if she is supporting Colin Smyth's amendment 12, which she worked with him on, she believes that the amendment in relation to which she listened to individuals who talked about the injured animal would be covered under that amendment rather than this one, which contradicts the animal welfare at that point?

Màiri McAllan: I am sorry, but I cannot follow the point that Rachael Hamilton is making. I am more than happy to take another intervention if she wants to put it to me again.

Rachael Hamilton: It is in reference to Finlay Carson's intervention with regard to not allowing an injured animal to be dispatched by a dog at the point at which it was injured.

Màiri McAllan: I appreciate Rachael Hamilton clarifying that point, but it brings me back to my previous point that, thanks to amendments that were made at stage 2, if the bill is passed, there will be provision for dogs to search for an injured or dead animal so that it can be dealt with in the most humane and effective way possible. However, if we pass the amendments on which Colin Smyth and I worked together, that will never constitute killing by a dog.

I cannot support amendment 36 in the name of Edward Mountain, either. It appears to seek to allow a pack of dogs to kill a wild mammal without any caveats at all. Under amendment 36, a person need only attempt to kill a wild mammal before they could set a pack of dogs on it. I have been very clear that banning the chasing and killing of wild mammals with packs of dogs is the fundamental premise of the bill.

Edward Mountain: I am grateful to the minister for giving way. That is definitely not my intention. The amendment makes it clear that the intention is to allow more than two dogs to hunt for an injured animal. It is not a question of hunting and killing the animal; it is about hunting and flushing it in order to allow it to be dispatched humanely. Does she not agree that that is the way that all people in the countryside believe that animals should be dispatched? Will she not reconsider the issue? If it were something that people had a long time to do, maybe they could get a licence to be allowed more

dogs, but this relates to a situation that is urgent, when an animal is suffering and it is necessary to dispatch it. I believe that the minister may have misunderstood the amendment.

Màiri McAllan: I want to clarify that, in this instance and in the other instances in which Edward Mountain suggests that I have misunderstood him, I have not done so; I am simply exploring the multifaceted issues that he raises. I understand that the situation that he presented is one in which someone wants to find an injured animal, but I am telling him that the provisions that were proposed at stage 2 to enable dogs to be used to search for a dead animal are sufficient to rise to the circumstances that he describes.

The other side of that is that we have to guard against any prohibition that we introduce being used as a loophole, as we know happened with the 2002 act. I fear that the amendment that he is proposing, which would allow a pack of dogs to search for an injured animal, would be used as a loophole in the aftermath of the bill and therefore, for that and other reasons, I cannot support it.

The Deputy Presiding Officer (Annabelle Ewing): Members will note that we have passed the agreed time limit for the debate on this group of amendments to finish. I exercise my power under standing orders rule 9.8.4A(c), to allow the debate on the group to continue beyond the limit in order to avoid it being unreasonably curtailed.

I call Colin Smyth to wind up and to press or withdraw amendment 34.

Colin Smyth: I welcome the Government's support for my amendments to stop dogs being used to kill an injured wild mammal. The minister has addressed the scenarios that were raised by Finlay Carson and Rachael Hamilton. There is genuine concern that allowing dogs to be used to kill animals in any circumstances could be used as a cover for the use of dogs being dispatched to kill animals in all circumstances, which would undermine a key aim of the bill.

However, I am disappointed that there was not more support—

Rachael Hamilton: I accept that Colin Smyth is opposed to certain aspects of rural country sports, but he needs to consider the fact that the bill could undermine the highest standards of animal welfare—being able to dispatch a wild predator efficiently and effectively is an important tool, particularly for farmers.

Colin Smyth: I am not opposed to sport; I am opposed to intolerable animal cruelty. It was probably more than 20 years ago that the Parliament had a debate on whether it was acceptable to use dogs to tear mammals apart.

We thought that that issue was settled but, in the eyes of Rachael Hamilton, it seems not to have been.

I am disappointed that there was not more support for my other amendments to remove the use of birds of prey as a permitted method of killing. As I said during the debate on the second group of amendments, the Government's argument that preventing wild mammals from being killed by a bird of prey cannot be included seems to centre around the idea that it is already a permitted activity. However, the Parliament has the power to change that, so it is a weak argument. This is a missed opportunity to ensure that the bill is as strong on animal welfare as it could be.

The minister argued that such a ban was not included in the original scope of the bill. As I said in my opening comments, it is the right thing to do and the Government has form for introducing additional amendments to legislation when it suited the Government to do so. For that reason, I will press amendment 34.

Amendment 36 disagreed to.

Section 4—Licence for use of more than two dogs in connection with section 3

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 5 is on licences for use of more than two dogs. Amendment 37, in the name of Ariane Burgess, is grouped with amendments 38, 39, 2, 40 to 48, 3, 4, 49 to 53 and 72 to 94. I point out that, if amendment 41 is agreed to, I cannot call amendments 42 or 43 and that, if amendment 75 is agreed to, I cannot call amendments 76 or 77 as a result of pre-emptions.

Ariane Burgess: My amendments in the group seek to make the licensing scheme more stringent, accountable and transparent so that it cannot be used as a loophole for the very forms of hunting that the bill seeks to ban. [Interruption.] I am going to stop for a moment, because I am finding people leaving the chamber distracting.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I ask members who are leaving the chamber to do so quietly and quickly, please.

Ariane Burgess: Thank you, Presiding Officer.

Amendments 37 and 72 are intended to determine whether more detail will be required, as part of the licence application process, on what the dogs will be used for. Sections 4 and 8 state that the licensing authority may require specific information as part of an application, but it is noted only that that may include the number of dogs and the number of guns that the applicant would like to use. I believe that it is just as important for the licensing authority to be told exactly what the applicant intends to do with those dogs and guns. For example, if the applicant wants to hunt under the exception of

"preventing the spread of disease",

they should explain which disease, which species will be targeted, how many animals will be involved, and how many will be killed.

My amendments 47 and 81 are also about detail. They specify a few reporting requirements, including the number of wild mammals hunted or killed, the specific location where any kills occurred and—crucially—whether that achieved the purpose for which the licence was granted. It may be that the licensing authority, which is understood to be NatureScot, would require such detail, as is required on the beaver licence returns forms, for example. However, I would like reassurance that that will definitely be the case.

Amendments 45 and 79 would ensure that licences would allow only the minimum number of dogs that NatureScot believes would be effective. The bill currently says that a licence

"may only permit ... the minimum number of dogs",

but that makes it sound as if NatureScot could choose to permit more. These amendments would remove that ambiguity.

I am sure that NatureScot will be sensible about the number of dogs that should be allowed for licensed hunting, but such a stipulation would help to remind it to think, every time that it issues a licence, about the maximum number of dogs that should be allowed in that particular case.

My amendment 93, on a register of licences, was inspired by Christine Grahame's amendment 4. After discussing the details with both Christine Grahame and the minister, I felt that it was important to add to Ms Grahame's idea. My amendment replicates her point that NatureScot must keep a register of licences, but it would apply that to section 8 as well as section 4, which would mean that it would apply to all licences.

Instead of requiring the entire register to be published, which could present data protection concerns, my amendment specifies certain data that must be made publicly available, such as

"the number of dogs permitted"

and the location where the hunting is allowed. Finally, my amendment would require that that data is "made available before" the start date of the licence. In that way, if enforcement officers or members of the public witness somebody using multiple dogs for hunting, they can consult the public register to check that the activity is licensed. That would improve transparency, accountability and enforcement.

I support Christine Grahame's amendment, but I encourage members to vote for mine as well, for the reasons that I have outlined.

My amendments 38 and 73 would require licence applications to

"be accompanied by an ethical wildlife management plan"—

Finlay Carson: Will the member give way on that point?

Ariane Burgess: I will not take an intervention from the member. I have a lot to get through, and I am aware of what we have heard about time.

The amendments also state that that ethical wildlife management plan must be accepted by NatureScot before a licence is granted.

Amendments 51 and 84 define an ethical wildlife management plan and explain what it must cover. In brief, it must set out how the applicant will achieve a long-term solution that causes the least harm to the fewest number of animals. That draws on the seven international principles for ethical wildlife control, which have been debated in the chamber, thanks to Colin Smyth, and considered extensively by the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee. In fact, the Government's own Scottish Animal Welfare Commission stated that

"it would be valuable to apply the International Consensus Principles for Ethical Wildlife Control"

to the bill.

Amendments 39 and 74 would give NatureScot the power to reject the licence application on the basis of an unsatisfactory ethical wildlife management plan, or require it to be revised.

My remaining amendments in the group also aim to ensure that any licensed hunting with dogs is as ethical as possible, but they take a more open approach. Amendments 50, 52, 83 and 85 broadly define ethical wildlife management, drawing on NatureScot's definition of wildlife management and on evidence that the Rural

Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee received about the importance of an evidence-based approach that prioritises animal welfare.

Amendments 44 and 78 simply state that NatureScot must be satisfied that the hunting will comply

"with best practice in ethical wildlife management".

That would avoid locking in any specific ethical principles or requirements at this time.

Amendments 53 and 86 would give Scottish ministers powers to provide further information on any of

"the definitions in subsection (6)."

That would mean that ministers could identify, develop or update a set of principles or criteria for best practice, which could draw on the outcome of the forthcoming species licensing review. Amendment 40 is a consequential formatting change.

I come to other amendments in the group. I will support Colin Smyth's amendments 46, 49, 80 and 82 on the same topic of ethical wildlife management. Amendments 46 and 80 would add

"adhering to a set of standards based on ethical wildlife management"

to the list of licence compliance conditions that NatureScot may set. Those amendments do not specify a particular set of standards. Colin Smyth's amendments 49 and 82 define ethical principles for the context of the bill, which are, like my amendments on the ethical wildlife management plans, based on the seven international ethical principles.

I also support Christine Grahame's amendments 2 and 3, which would remove the option of granting a licence to a "category of persons" to ensure that licensing remains the exception to an exception.

I do not support any of Rachael Hamilton's amendments in the group, because they seek to loosen, rather than strengthen, the licensing scheme, and they would open up new exceptions for more hunting with dogs.

I urge members to support all my amendments in the group, Christine Grahame's amendments and Colin Smyth's amendments, but I ask them to vote against Rachael Hamilton's amendments in the group.

I move amendment 37.

Christine Grahame (Midlothian South, Tweeddale and Lauderdale) (SNP): In the

interests of time, I intend to speak only to my amendments in the group. Amendments 2 and 3 seek to delete from sections 4(4)(a) and 4(5)(a) the phrase "category of persons". The minister knows that I raised the issue at stage 2 through a probing amendment. My rationale for doing so was that I was unclear about the legal status of "category of persons", especially in relation to enforcement or breach of a licence. For example, who would be charged if a licence holder breached the terms of the licence?

I note that section 4(1) states:

"A person may apply for a licence permitting the use of more than two dogs".

It talks about a "person". There is no addition of "category of persons". There seems to be, at the very least, a technical inconsistency. Section 4(4)(a) refers to granting a licence to a "person" or "category of persons". Similarly, section 4(5)(a) refers to a

"person or category of persons".

As I said, that seems to be inconsistent with section 4(1). I look forward to the minister's explanation if I have misunderstood the position.

Amendment 4 seeks to make the register of licences public. Again, I raised the issue at stage 2 through a probing amendment, and I will quote the minister's response. She said:

"I am sympathetic to that; transparency in how licences operate is always desirable. NatureScot already successfully shares a lot of information on wildlife management licences, not least—as has been seen recently—in detailed reporting on the operation of the licences to manage beavers, so there is a precedent. There are also plans to publish data on all of NatureScot's licences, but we need to work carefully through the general data protection regulation legislation in order to do that in a way that is legally watertight and does not undermine the GDPR

That being the case, and having listened to the exchanges, I will continue to consider Christine Grahame's points, and I assure her today that I will commit to going as far as possible within the remit of the GDPR to publish what it is that she is asking for."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 7 December 2022; c 83-84.]

I have not seen any amendments from the Government, so I ask for an explanation from the minister. I know that, in exceptional circumstances, a licence that is granted can go to the land. However, if the register is not public, I am concerned about how an observer or someone who takes a particular interest in the matter will know whether the terms of that licence have been breached if they do not know what land it covers and who is responsible for the exercise of the licence.

Rachael Hamilton: Amendments 41 and 75, in my name, aim to reflect oral evidence that the

Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee received. They state that effectiveness is to be understood as relating to whether the alternatives are practical and possible. There needs to be clarity in the bill that that is the case.

Alternatives might be effective but not necessarily practical, affordable or in the best interests of the welfare of the animals involved. My amendments would also help NatureScot to avoid facing legal challenges to licences issued on the basis that it failed to meet what amounts to a test in which it must be satisfied that there was no effective alternative. What really matters is whether the use of more than two dogs is necessary and will make a significant contribution to the purpose for which a licence has been granted.

The proposed wording in amendments 41 and 75 would also recognise, as the current wording in the bill does not, that the use of dogs to flush to guns under licence does not mean that other methods of fox control will not carry on alongside licensed control using dogs. Control is normally a combination of methods that complement one another and may be used concurrently. There is a danger of thinking that it is an either/or scenario. The reality is that successful predator control involves a variety of methods. The methods that are used, when, where and how they are used, and the combination of methods at any given time will depend on terrain and other considerations. That is best decided on by those who are conducting the control and wildlife management on the ground.

Amendments 42 and 76 would replicate the wording in the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, as amended, and as it applies in Scotland in relation to other wildlife licensing. As such, the relevant authority can issue a general licence for control of birds if it is satisfied that there is no other satisfactory solution. The person relying on that licence must also be clear that the action that is taken is necessary, and that it can be done in conjunction with other methods being deployed.

The evidence is clear that fox control is necessary—that is accepted by the Scottish Government and Lord Bonomy—and that packs of dogs are key to that, even if it is done in conjunction with other methods deployed concurrently. Amendments 43 and 77 seek to recognise that predator control involves the use of a number of methods that may be used concurrently and in different combinations at different times of the year and over different terrains, even on a single landholding. The need for a combination of methods in controlling foxes is no different from the licensing that applies to the control of, for example, birds, to prevent damage.

Amendment 48 aims to ensure that the bill recognises that fox control is a year-round activity that is undertaken not simply when damage has occurred but to prevent damage from occurring. Farmers and land managers should have to apply only annually for a licence. They can then deploy their licence days as needed, both to prevent damage and when they need to respond to damage that has been caused.

Amendment 87 would ensure for the avoidance of doubt that the control or eradication of invasive species and other species that are considered a pest to humans, livestock or plants and animals, as described in the bill, would not breach the terms of a licence that is issued under sections 4 or 8. I have already outlined the need to ensure that the bill does not prevent individuals from contributing to the control of pest species or invasive non-native species for the sake of Scotland's food security and biodiversity. Amendment 87 would add to the provisions in the bill to ensure that that does not happen.

Similarly, amendment 90 would allow an individual to apply for a licence permitting the use of more than two dogs if they can demonstrate that control of the pest species would benefit

"the protection and restoration of ground nesting birds."

There is an arbitrary distinction between those seeking to protect livestock and those seeking to achieve environmental benefits, as part of a scheme that seems fairly discriminatory to rural stakeholders.

Amendment 88, which is also in my name, seeks to ensure that the bill upholds the rights of individuals to the peaceful enjoyment of their property. That right was enshrined by the Council of Europe in 1950. I have no doubt that the minister, with her legal background, will be familiar with the case of Tre Traktörer Aktiebolag v Sweden, or at least with the principle that comes from it that a licence for the use of private property can itself constitute property. The principle was first legally established in the case of Colonial Sugar Refining Company Ltd v Melbourne Harbour Trust in 1927, in which it was found that people cannot be deprived of rights unless the intention to do so is made in clear and unambiguous terms in legislation.

If the minister is unable to support my amendment 88, it would be very helpful if she could provide assurances on the record that that means that exercising one's rights under article 1 of the European convention on human rights will not be classed as a breach of condition, and nor will there be any interference with the rights in possessing a licence, which, as I just mentioned, is also a property that is protected under article 1.

I ask the minister to acknowledge that, sometimes, the circumstances of protecting livestock from harm will mean that there will not be a number of guns set up in prepared locations, and that it will not always be practical to meet all the conditions that are set out. There will be times when farmers will need to take action that protects their possessions, livestock and livelihoods and that reduces suffering to other animals. In such cases, there should be no adverse effects on future licence applications, and nor should a licence that a farmer holds be removed.

Amendments 89 and 94 follow a similar vein to amendment 90, which I have already discussed. They outline further circumstances under which the use of more than two dogs would provide a practical solution to control pest species. Those include pest control on rough and hilly ground and areas of dense cover: weather-related considerations; the management of wild boar and feral pigs, as seen in Aberdeenshire recently; activities in heavily populated areas where guns cannot be used for various reasons; recovering wild mammals involved in vehicle collisions; and animal welfare considerations such as protecting dogs from exhaustion and ensuring that pest species are humanely despatched by trained marksmen.

It is important that those considerations, which we took evidence on in the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, are covered in the bill. The amendments are worded in such a way that ministers can add to the circumstances under which a licence may be granted and allow the Parliament to make a final decision on whether provisions may be added to them.

Amendment 91 ensures that licences are granted or rejected by the relevant authority in a timeous manner by placing a duty on that authority to respond to an application within 30 days. The 30-day figure is based on the usual time that it takes to get a wildlife licence across the United Kingdom.

Amendment 92 makes provision for emergency licence applications

"in order to effectively achieve a purpose under section 3(2) or 7(2)."

Given that pest control may sometimes need to be undertaken at very short notice, reacting to scenarios such as livestock being attacked by foxes, there is a need to ensure that emergency measures can be taken, when required, in a proactive way, when the use of more than two dogs would be an appropriate means of addressing such a scenario.

I will not be supporting all the other amendments in the group.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call Colin Smyth to speak to amendment 46 and other amendments in the group.

Colin Smyth: The bill as it stands would allow for a continuation of the use of packs of dogs in hunting under a licence. It therefore fails to fully close the loopholes that exist in the current legislation. The bill should not repeat the mistakes that were made in the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002. It must have animal welfare at its heart and end for good the cruel activity of hunting with packs of dogs.

It is disappointing that previous attempts to remove section 4 have been unsuccessful, so I and others have lodged amendments at stage 3 to make sure that any licensing system is as robust as possible.

Amendments 46, 49, 80 and 82, in my name, would allow NatureScot to require licence applicants to meet standards in the application process that are drawn up in line with an ethical framework such as the international—

Jim Fairlie: Will the member take an intervention?

Colin Smyth: I will take an intervention.

Jim Fairlie: Is the member not satisfied of the fact that, with a minimum number of guns at the end of a drive, a fox is not going to escape and therefore allow a chase to ensue?

Colin Smyth: I am not entirely clear that that would address the concern that people have. If you use a pack of dogs, the risk of one or more of those dogs chasing the fox is still there. The whole purpose of the bill is to minimise that risk by reducing the number of dogs to two.

Jim Fairlie: Will the member take another intervention?

Colin Smyth: I will take a further intervention.

Jim Fairlie: Thank you for your generosity. The point is that, when hounds are driving a fox out of cover, generally the fox will never see the hounds until the very last moment of the chase. Therefore, if you are driving the fox out to standing guns, it will be shot before the hounds ever get anywhere near it. That is the purpose of the amendment that I put in at stage 2—it is to take away the ability for hounds to chase foxes to kill them.

Colin Smyth: I still do not think that that addresses the point. The purpose of the bill is to reduce the number of dogs to two, to minimise the risk of dogs chasing and ultimately killing the fox. That is the circumstance that the Government is in favour of achieving. My argument is that that should be used in all circumstances, so the number of dogs should be reduced to two, which is the main aim of the bill. The Government

disagrees and thinks that packs should continue to be allowed. However, I do not see that the point that Mr Fairlie makes is in any way relevant.

As I said, amendments 46, 49, 80 and 82 would allow NatureScot to require licence applicants to meet standards in the application process that are drawn up in line with the ethical framework that I mentioned earlier—the international consensus principles for ethical wildlife control, which are an existing internationally recognised example of such standards.

Amendments 49 and 82 would ensure that specific ethical principles are included in the bill, enshrining those in law. As set out in amendment 82, those principles are to

"prioritise prevention and mitigation measures wherever possible ... demonstrate that serious damage is being caused to people, ecosystems or other animals ... set measurable, adaptive, outcome-based objectives that will reduce the damage ... be based on the specifics of the situation rather than wholesale application to target species ... use methods that predictably minimise animal welfare harms and the number of animals harmed ... integrate all measures into plans for systematic long-term management"

and to

"base decisions on the specifics of the situation rather than wholesale application to target species."

At stage 2, the minister argued that we should wait for NatureScot's review of licensed wildlife management. However, when giving evidence during stage 1, NatureScot told the committee that its approach is "fairly well aligned" with those ethical principles.

It has also been argued that amendments in support of an ethical approach when considering the principles behind the criteria for an application for a licence somehow go against the shared approach to wildlife management. First of all, there are a number of stakeholders who are part of the shared approach who oppose the bill altogether. The changes to wildlife management through the bill go far beyond what I am proposing in my amendments on the licensing scheme. The Government and others do not mention that threat to the shared approach when arguing in support of the bill—and rightly so, because the shared approach is ultimately about working together and how best to do so within the legal framework that the Parliament sets. Clearly, there would be a shared approach when it came to the final detail of any licensing application process.

The minister has previously said several times as the bill has progressed that she has not ruled out taking an ethical approach in the future, but this is the time to make up her mind. The bill has been delayed by several years already and there

has been ample opportunity to consider the matter.

I fully support all Ariane Burgess's amendments in the group, which also require that anyone who is granted a licence must adhere to the principles of ethical wildlife management.

Amendments 47 and 81 specify further details that NatureScot might require licence holders to report on, including, in amendment 81,

"the number of wild mammals ... killed"

and

"whether this achieved the purpose for which the licence was granted",

which would help to provide transparency and ensure that licences remain an exception to an exception.

Amendments 41 to 43 and 75 to 77, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, would all, in slightly different ways, lower the criteria for permitting the use of more than two dogs and would therefore further weaken a bill that I already think is weak enough.

If we are to have licensing at all, it is important that it is an exception to an exception and that it is available only when no other method is available. We strongly oppose those amendments.

Amendment 91 would impose a time limit in which NatureScot could respond to a licence application. Amendment 92 would create a new emergency licence, which NatureScot would be required to grant or refuse within 24 hours of receiving an application. Both amendments would restrict the agency's ability to carry out a comprehensive inquiry or assessment. Therefore, we do not support them.

I urge members to support the amendments in my name and the amendments in the name of Ariane Burgess that would include the ethical principles for wildlife management in the bill to ensure that the licensing scheme is as robust as possible. I also urge members to support the amendment in the name of Christine Grahame on the issue of keeping a register.

Màiri McAllan: This is a large group of amendments, but I duly want to give the Government's response to each of them. I will try to be quick, but please bear with me.

Amendments 37 and 72, in the name of Ariane Burgess, seek to add to the bill further examples of information that might be required by the licensing authority in an application under sections 4 and 8. The bill already includes some of what will be required. It states that any application for a licence must include any information that NatureScot requires. That means that the licensing authority already has wide discretion

over the information that it will routinely request when developing the detail of the regime.

I fear that the amendments risk making the legislation too prescriptive. There are also practical difficulties with them. For example, the bill already provides that the application must specify the species of wild animal to which it relates. Ms Burgess's amendment would add provision in relation to the number of wild mammals to which the application relates. That would be practically difficult to anticipate. I am also very conscious of my commitment that, although it is an exception to an exception and is to be construed narrowly, I want the licensing scheme to be workable where that is essential. Therefore, I cannot support the amendments.

On Ms Burgess's amendments that would require the applicant to prepare and submit an ethical wildlife management plan, and amendments 47 and 78, which would require that, before granting a licence, the authority must be satisfied

"that the use of the licence ... complies with best practice in ethical wildlife management",

under the bill, a licence will be granted only when the licensing tests have been met. Those tests include ensuring that there is a valid reason for the species to be controlled and—this is crucial and we must not lose sight of it—that there

"is no other solution which would be effective in achieving the purpose".

That is, rightly, a high bar.

Although I am sympathetic to the intention behind the amendments, I cannot support them. The requirement to be subject to an ethical wildlife management plan does not form part of other licensing schemes that NatureScot operates, nor has it formed part of the evidence that we have taken up to now. Even if we agreed that the approach was appropriate, to add it in an ad hoc way would not be appropriate.

Ariane Burgess will be aware that, under the Bute house agreement, the Scottish Government will shortly commence a review of licensed wildlife management across the piece. I hope that she appreciates that I should not agree to impose changes on a particular category of licence before we have completed that review.

There are a number of technical issues with the amendments, but I will not go into the detail on those, in the interests of time.

Amendment 79, also in the name of Ariane Burgess, would change the test when it comes to the obligation on the licensing authority, by tweaking the wording to "must only". I cannot support the amendment, which is not necessary. The bill says that the licence

"may only permit the use of the minimum number of dogs",

so the effect is that the licensing authority must always restrict to the minimum the number of dogs. Given that the provision provides for what I think that Ms Burgess is seeking, I ask her not to move amendment 79.

Amendments 47 and 81 set out further reporting requirements that could be included in sections 4 and 8. The bill already provides that a licence is subject to compliance with conditions, one of which is a reporting requirement in relation to activities that are carried out under licence. The reporting requirements that are placed on licence holders are best decided by NatureScot, in collaboration with stakeholders, as the licensing accompanying scheme and guidance are developed. It is not standard practice to include in a bill the kind of information that Ms Burgess proposes—her proposed approach was not taken in the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The bill is drafted to provide for a framework for licences, so that guidance can be set out in consultation with stakeholders. That work is very much under way with, for example, countryside management and animal welfare stakeholders. For those reasons, I cannot support amendments 47 and 81.

I am sympathetic to the intention behind Ariane Burgess's amendment on a public register. I agree that transparency is important in the context of not just the licences that we are talking about but all the licences that NatureScot operates. That is why, under the Bute house agreement, we committed, as I said, to

"review the wider species licensing system"

and to the introduction of a public register of licences

"to improve transparency, bearing in mind data protection and safety of licence holders."

As I said at stage 2, it is better to proceed on the agreed plan in the Bute house agreement and to publish information in a co-ordinated way, so that I can fully consider the general data protection regulation implications that I am sure will come into play. Therefore, I cannot support that amendment.

On amendments 2 and 3, in the name of Christine Grahame, I understand Ms Grahame's desire to tighten up the granting of licences. I agree that licences should be construed narrowly. Equally, they should be workable and available where they are essential. Sections 4(4)(a) and 8(4)(a) specify that a licence

"may be granted to a particular person or to a category of persons".

Ms Grahame's amendments would remove the phrase "a category of persons". The law is clear that the word "person" includes corporate entities,

companies and partnerships. Therefore, under amendments 2 and 3, licences could still be granted to informal bodies as well as to individuals and corporate entities such as companies and partnerships. However, they could not be granted to a broader category of persons, such as a group of farmers in a defined geographical area.

Christine Grahame: I seek clarity on why the bill says that an application will be made by

"the person or category of persons".

Let us say that three landowners, A, B and C, want a licence to cover their land—I know that a licence will apply to an area. A applies for the licence. Does A advise that they are doing so on behalf of themselves and B and C? I want to know how the approach will work; it does not seem to be consistent across the sections of the bill.

Màiri McAllan: I was going to come to that point. I am glad that Christine Grahame has brought it up and equally glad to assure her that that is not a technical oversight. The references to "person" and "persons" reflect the fact that a licence could be granted to a person or to a group of people but that NatureScot would always require a named individual to be responsible for the licence. For example, in the situation that Christine Grahame narrates, three farmers could apply for a licence to cover three different farms but would still require one individual to be responsible for that licence. That might be in order to allow for reporting or to provide a point of contact for Police Scotland.

I know that Christine Grahame reassurance at stage 2 with regard to liability and how that would affect the named applicant. I point out that it would always be the person who commits the crime on the ground who would be liable. However, there are additional provisions in the bill to allow a landowner or applicant, if they are not the person carrying out the work on the ground, to be found liable for "knowingly causing or permitting" illegal activity on their land. In addition, the bill gives NatureScot wide discretion to decide not to issue a licence; for example, if it has any concerns about previous breaches of licensing conditions or any suspicion about illegal activity. I hope that that answer gives Christine Grahame some comfort.

Ms Grahame's amendment 4 is similar to Ariane Burgess's amendment and would require NatureScot to make available a public register. Ms Grahame referred to some of what I said at stage 2, which remains the case. I absolutely understand the desire for openness and transparency, but I believe that the right approach is to review wildlife licensing right across the piece, rather than to take decisions on an ad hoc basis.

Christine Grahame: Will the minister accept an intervention?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Please be brief, Ms Grahame.

Christine Grahame: I hope that the minister will give some indication, either now or during the debate, of when that review will take place and when we will have a report on that.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Please answer briefly, minister.

Màiri McAllan: The commitment is there in black and white in the Bute house agreement. I, and the same officials who are part of the bill team, will undertake that work, which we hope to commence very shortly. I am sure that Ms Grahame will understand that we would like to pass this bill first.

I move to Rachael Hamilton's amendments 41 to 43 and 75 to 77.

Beatrice Wishart (Shetland Islands) (LD): Will the minister accept an intervention?

Màiri McAllan: I am happy to.

Beatrice Wishart: I understand Ms Hamilton's reason for lodging amendment 91. I have raised concerns about NatureScot's capacity to take on new responsibilities. Is the minister confident that NatureScot has both the relevant expertise and the resources to respond to licence applications within a realistic timeframe? We all want the licensing scheme to be workable.

Màiri McAllan: I am confident. That is an important question about something that we must bear in mind as we give NatureScot new responsibilities as the licensing authority. My officials and I have worked very closely with NatureScot throughout the development of the bill. NatureScot is confident of being able to manage the additional workload and has a long history of responding to routine licensing requests and expediting any where there is a need for urgency. That will continue.

I cannot support Rachael Hamilton's amendments 41 to 43 and 75 to 77, because they would change the test for obtaining a licence in a way that makes less clear what is required from both the applicant and the licensing authority. The amendments appear to introduce a separate, stand-alone test for the applicant to meet, without specifying what that might mean in practice. I cannot support anything that might bring vague provisions into the legislation.

Rachael Hamilton's amendment 48 would increase the period of time during which a licence under section 4 can be used, changing that from 14 days within a six-month period to 14 days over 12 months. I said during our stage 2 discussions in

December that I believe that 14 days over six months is an appropriate period of time, allowing flexibility without an increase in the number of hunting days. My opinion has not changed since stage 2, so I cannot support those amendments.

I will move on as swiftly as possible to amendments 87 and 88, which are also in the name of Rachael Hamilton. I have to admit that I have struggled somewhat to understand the logic behind those amendments. To me—this has not really changed due to anything that I have observed this afternoon—they appear to seek to write into the bill circumstances where a person would not be breaching licence conditions even though they had demonstrably breached those conditions.

The amendments would undermine the provisions and the safeguards in the licensing scheme and create numerous loopholes. For example, amendment 87 would mean that a person could apply for a licence to use more than two dogs for the control of invasive non-native species. The bill already provides that NatureScot may include in the licence any condition that it considers appropriate and that that should be complied with.

Amendment 88 touches on article 1 of protocol 1 to the European convention on human rights. I do not want to go too greatly into the detail of that, but I note that, as a public body, NatureScot is already obliged to comply with the terms of the ECHR, including the qualified right of article 1 of protocol 1.

I cannot support Rachael Hamilton's amendment 89, which proposes an additional licence in certain circumstances. It would create a new provision that would allow a person to apply for a licence to use more than two dogs in certain circumstances without any of the safeguards that we have very deliberately and carefully built into the bill. The provision also refers to "pest species", which is not a term that I will use readily, if at all.

Similarly, Rachael Hamilton's amendment 90 seeks to ensure that a person may apply for a licence under a new section to permit the use of more than two dogs to deal with "pest species". Again, the Parliament will note that that is not a term that the Government will readily use or accept.

Rachael Hamilton's amendment 91 would require NatureScot to grant or refuse a licence or respond to the applicant within 30 days. I had an exchange with Beatrice Wishart on that. A turnaround of 30 days is already standard practice for NatureScot, and in some cases it is already far quicker. Of course, the processing times for

licences will vary depending on the type of licence, the quality of the application and the supporting documents that are submitted.

As I said to Beatrice Wishart, I have confidence that NatureScot can continue to turn licences round in that period and that it has sufficient provision to deal with the need to expedite cases where that may arise. That point addresses Rachael Hamilton's amendment 92, which I also cannot support.

Rachael Hamilton's final amendment in the group is amendment 94, which would require the Scottish Government to make regulations for the licensing of more than two dogs for all of the 10-plus circumstances that are set out in the amendment. I believe that that is entirely unnecessary. Most if not all of the circumstances that are listed in the amendment are already covered by other areas of the bill or do not necessitate the use of more than two dogs.

For example, in relation to licences for the use of more than two dogs in rough, hilly terrain, I have been clear all along that one of the main reasons for introducing the licence has been about responding to Lord Bonomy's comments on terrain. We have discussed recovering a wild mammal that has been injured in a vehicle collision and ensuring that foxes are humanely dispatched. I believe that the licensing scheme strikes a balance, but it is an exception to an exception and it must be construed narrowly.

Colin Smyth's amendments 46, 49, 80 and 82 propose that applications for a licence to use more than two dogs be subject to adherence to a set of standards based on ethical principles for humane wildlife management. As I stated in response to Ariane Burgess in relation to her amendment on a wildlife management plan, I am sympathetic to the intention here, but I cannot support the amendments.

As we discussed at stage 2, NatureScot has developed that shared approach to wildlife management, which is a valuable framework and one that has been developed in conjunction with a wide variety of stakeholders from conservation, animal welfare and land management. That includes groups such as the RSPB, Scottish Land & Estates, the National Farmers Union and the Cairngorms and Loch Lomond national parks.

The consensus that has been demonstrated by the shared approach is not to be disregarded lightly and it is right that we give it a chance to operate before considering alternative frameworks. For that reason, I cannot support Colin Smyth's amendments in the group.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I advise members that at about 5.30 pm—obviously not in

the middle of a vote—there will be a comfort break of 10 minutes.

I call Ariane Burgess to wind up and to press or withdraw amendment 37.

Ariane Burgess: I thank the minister and members for their comments about the amendments in the group, and I thank Colin Smyth for supporting all my amendments. I am aware that the Scottish Government and the police are determined to put an end to fox hunting, but a small group of people is equally determined to continue that cruel practice. Just last weekend, there was a news story about the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and the police clamping down on illegal fox hunting in England through raids in which dogs were seized and arrests were made.

To deter fox hunting and enable successful law enforcement, our legislation needs to be watertight. That is why we should consider whether each section and each amendment could be used as a loophole for continued fox hunting.

I understand what the minister said about not being too prescriptive. However, obtaining a licence to use more than two dogs to hunt wild mammals should not be too easy.

Edward Mountain: Will the member give way?

Ariane Burgess: I will continue. It is reasonable that those who want to hunt with several dogs should have to have a good and specific reason for doing so; that they should have to have a plan for exactly how they will use the dogs to achieve their stated purpose; and that they should make that known to the licensing authority, so that it can be sure that it does not license an activity that the bill is intended to ban. Sufficiently detailed applications, licence conditions and reporting will be critical to ensuring that the licensing system is transparent and that licensed hunting is accountable.

The amendments about ethical wildlife management aim simply to ensure that licensed hunting is as ethical as possible. How can that not be supportable? If the Government supports the principles of ethical wildlife management in theory, why not demonstrate that by voting for one of the options and by ensuring that NatureScot and the species licensing review take ethical principles into account? The Scottish Government could show leadership on that.

NatureScot's shared approach concordat keeps being compared to ethical principles, but it is not comparable. The shared approach is not about ethics but about working together, clear communication, adaptation and so on. It is not all that relevant. It includes one short section on

safeguarding welfare, but that is out of date and does not recognise sentience.

I press amendment 37.

Edward Mountain: On a point of order, Presiding Officer. I have been extremely encouraged at the number of interventions that members have allowed me this afternoon. I am grateful for that, and I will always allow members to intervene on me. During the afternoon, Ariane Burgess has spoken quite a lot but has not taken one single intervention. I know that that is her choice but, Presiding Officer, will you confirm that there is no time limit—

The Deputy First Minister and Cabinet Secretary for Covid Recovery (John Swinney): That is not a point of order.

The Presiding Officer (Alison Johnstone): Let us hear Mr Mountain, thank you. Mr Mountain, please continue. [Interruption.] Mr Swinney, Mr Mountain is ready to speak.

Edward Mountain: Presiding Officer, I seek your guidance to confirm that no member has been given a cut-off time for their speech, so they are in a position to accept interventions. Although Mr Swinney might not like that, I am sure that you will give us a ruling. [Interruption.]

The Presiding Officer: I ask members to please refrain from shouting across the chamber.

It is absolutely the case that whether an individual member accepts an intervention is wholly in their hands. The Parliament has voted on a timetabling motion, but, as ever, Presiding Officers in the chair will seek to accommodate members as far as possible.

We will move on. The question is, that amendment 37 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

Members: No.

The Presiding Officer: There will be a division.

I call Kaukab Stewart.

Kaukab Stewart: On behalf of Stuart McMillan, I vote no.

The Presiding Officer: We will ensure that that is recorded.

The vote is closed.

The Cabinet Secretary for Social Justice, Housing and Local Government (Shona Robison): On a point of order, Presiding Officer. My app did not connect; I would have voted no.

The Presiding Officer: We will ensure that that is recorded.

The Minister for Higher Education and Further Education, Youth Employment and

Section 7—Exception: environmental benefit

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 6 is on environmental benefit exception. Amendment 69, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, is the only amendment in the group.

Rachael Hamilton: At stage 2, the minister explained that a scheme could include a plan, and she used the example of a plan by a group of gamekeepers. Amendment 69 specifically provide for that as a means of gaining an exception in the bill.

Although I accept that what amounts to a scheme will be clarified in the guidance that we await, it is important that the law recognises that land managers and gamekeepers might plan to control predators for important environmental reasons, such as managing the welfare of species. As I have mentioned, species such as the capercaillie and the curlew are at risk of extinction unless predators are controlled. Such plans are as important as schemes for organisations such as NatureScot and RSPB Scotland, as referred to in the bill's explanatory notes.

There needs to be certainty that the work of gamekeepers, land managers and farmers for environmental benefits, when the use of more than two dogs is needed as part of that management, can continue. The vast majority of management in Scotland takes place on private land and, without the work of land managers on the ground, the Government cannot hope to meet its biodiversity targets and goals and to protect our most vulnerable species.

I move amendment 69.

Màiri McAllan: In response to Rachael Hamilton's explanation for amendment 69, I note that the explanatory notes that accompany the bill set out that

"the requirement for a scheme means that the activity has to be planned"-

I stress the word "planned"—

"and designed for one of the subsection (2) purposes."

That could be anything from large-scale projects such as the eradication of stoats on Orkney, which is run by the Orkney Native Wildlife Project, to an individual gamekeeper planning a deer cull.

As I said at stage 2, it is my intention that further information about what may constitute a scheme for the purposes of applying for a licence under the exception will be set out in the licensing guidance that will be produced, should the bill be passed. The guidance will be developed following discussions with stakeholders, who will have the opportunity to review and comment on it.

Amendment 69 is in line with my understanding of what will constitute a scheme—namely, that it could also be a plan or, indeed, a design or programme of action—so I am happy to support it.

Rachael Hamilton: I am very encouraged and grateful to hear the minister put some faith in gamekeepers and land managers. Faith in the majority of the content of the bill throughout its passage has been difficult to find. However, support for the amendment is a vote of confidence in the ability of gamekeepers and land managers to do their job, which I appreciate.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 7 is on duties to report. Amendment 95, in the name of Colin Smyth, is grouped with amendments 96, 101, 103, 104, 100 and 102.

Colin Smyth: As I have made clear at each stage of the bill, I disagree with the licensing provisions in it. However, if the provisions are to remain, we must ensure that the system works as it is intended to, with licences being granted only as a last resort.

My amendment 95 would create a duty for ministers to review the operation of the licensing scheme created by sections 4 and 8 every five years, to lay a report before Parliament after each review and to specify the actions to be taken as a result of the review or the reason for no action being taken.

In evidence to the committee at stage 1, NatureScot indicated that there should be capacity for the licensing scheme to evolve, based on experience. It said:

"There needs to be some means by which we can monitor the licensing regime, receive feedback on it and continue to refine it to ensure that it delivers what it says on the tin."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 22 June 2022; c 24.]

It is important that loopholes do not appear in the legislation further down the line as a result of the licensing scheme becoming outdated, becoming unfit for purpose or simply having unintended consequences. The requirement in amendment 95 for ministers to review the scheme's operation and then take appropriate action in response would ensure that the duty to report is as effective as it can be.

The first review must be carried out before 31 December 2028, and reviews must then be carried out every five years. For each review, ministers must consult those who have an interest in the licensing provisions, and the report of the review must be laid before Parliament. The Scottish Government must set out in that report any actions that it intends to take as a result of the review, or it must give a reason, if it decides that no action is required.

Requiring the report to be laid before Parliament would provide Parliament with the means to scrutinise the impact of the licensing scheme and be confident that it is working as intended and remains fit for purpose. It would also make sure that any issues or unintended consequences arising from the operation of the scheme are identified and that recommendations are put forward as to how those can be addressed in the future.

I urge members to support amendment 95, to ensure that, if a licensing scheme is continued with, it does not allow loopholes to open in the future.

Edward Mountain's amendment 96 would create a requirement to report on licensing, but it does not seek to have a review. Amendments 101 to 104 also seek to create a requirement to report. Although I think that there is merit in specifying areas that should be reported on, some of the areas in the amendments go beyond the scope of the bill and, more importantly, are very selective and try to make an argument rather than provide a balanced report. They largely ignore animal welfare issues in relation to the wild mammals that are searched for and flushed out—for example, in relation to the use of dogs below ground.

If Rachael Hamilton had engaged with others on her amendments, I suspect that there could have been agreement on what could be reported on. I cannot agree to the list in her amendments, but I think that it would be possible, as a result of my amendment, to allow such reviews and reporting to take place in the future.

I move amendment 95.

Edward Mountain: I will start by speaking to my amendment 96. I know that Governments do not necessarily like looking back at what has and has not been achieved, but it is really important that we do that. My amendment 96 would place a requirement on the Government, after two years of the operation of any licensing scheme, to declare information about the applications that have been granted and those that have been refused. There are slightly different areas under each of those, which can be seen in the amendment. I think that the Government should also declare how long it

takes for an application to be processed, and I would be very happy for the Government to add any other information that it feels is appropriate.

The minister said earlier that she was convinced that NatureScot had the facilities to do the licensing. I, too, am convinced that it has the facilities to do it, because I met staff and asked whether they had the ability to carry out the requirements of the bill and the various permutations of it and they said yes.

As far as Colin Smyth's amendment 95 is concerned, I am minded to hear what the minister says. It does not necessarily chime with me that there should be a review every five years. We are talking about legislation and, if it is not working, I would suggest that the whole act should be considered, not just the licensing. I will be grateful to hear what the minister has to say about that.

The amendments of my colleague Rachael Hamilton are really interesting, because they drill down into the effects of the legislation, including the effect that it will have on the countryside. For those reasons, I support them.

I ask members to support my amendment 96, on the basis that it would give the Parliament full information about what it is imposing and would allow it to make decisions in the future on whether licensing is appropriate and is achieving what it aims to do.

Rachael Hamilton: In speaking to my amendment 24, I talked about the opportunity that exists in the bill to make further provisions to address the illegal act of hare coursing. Amendment 101 seeks to ensure that ministers would report on the impact of the bill on hare coursing using dogs, and it outlines a way of taking further steps to reduce occurrences of that activity.

Amendment 103 would add extra provisions on matters for ministers to report on in relation to the impact of the bill. I am particularly concerned about the lack of consideration that has been given to the welfare of dogs that are involved in hunting. I am concerned that BASC, the Scottish Gamekeepers Association and moorland groups believe that, as a direct result of the bill, working dogs will face a cull. I believe that it is necessary for ministers to report on the impact that the bill will have on the rural economy and the livelihoods that depend on hunting, as well as on its long-term implications.

The bill also has a cultural heritage aspect. Unfortunately, the amendment that I lodged on that issue fell during stage 2, but I have brought it back, because I feel that the subject is yet to be debated. I believe that ensuring that ministers report on the impact that the bill has on those

matters would be an important step in assessing the bill's influence on our countryside.

Amendment 102 seeks to assess the impact of the bill on other aspects of the rural economy, including veterinary services, farriers and apprenticeships. heard We have from stakeholders, particularly BASC, the Kennel Club Scottish moorland groups, that one unintended consequence of the bill would be to erode the rural economy and much of our countryside culture. Many of us saw the film that was screened in Parliament last September that demonstrated exactly that. Amendment 102 therefore seeks to ensure that that is reported on. alongside any increasing strain that the bill may place on the mental health of rural workers, which might include increasing loneliness and isolation due to the loss of the social structure around hunting.

That issue has also been raised by the NFUS. We can see that in the call for a gamekeepers task force. Poor mental health in rural areas costs lives in Scotland, and I believe that it is right to ensure that our work here in Parliament does not exacerbate that. Like many rural stakeholders, I am afraid that the bill has the potential to make things worse. I would therefore appreciate a commitment from the Government to support amendment 102 to ensure that we assess whether the bill harms rural workers' mental health and to undertake constructive work to minimise that risk.

Amendment 100 focuses on ensuring that ministers report on the additional costs and resource requirements for public bodies that are involved in administering the provisions of the bill.

Regarding amendment 104, the Scottish Government has said from the outset of this process, beginning with the Bonomy review, that it wishes the necessary level of protection to be provided for foxes and other wild mammals, while allowing for the "effective and humane" control of those animals, where that is required. Lord Bonomy's report did not call for a two-dog limit. The aim of amendment 104 is to ensure that the Government monitors the bill's impact on land managers' ability to control foxes and protect livestock and wildlife, and its environmental and socioeconomic consequences. The amendment will ensure that the bill works as it was intended to.

Colin Smyth's amendment 95 lacks focus. Edward Mountain's amendment 96, which calls for reporting on licences, is much more detailed and is more relevant to assessing the impact of the bill.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Two members wish to make contributions. I will take both and hope for brief contributions.

Ariane Burgess: I speak in support of Colin Smyth's amendment 95, which creates a duty to

review the operation of the licensing scheme every five years and to take appropriate action. Our legislation must be watertight if it is to put a stop to fox hunting and other cruel activities that involve hunting with dogs, such as badger baiting. Unfortunately, the licensing scheme offers one of the biggest potential loopholes, so it should definitely be subject to periodic review. It will be particularly important to determine whether the licence to use dogs for environmental benefit is being used for legitimate purposes and whether it is necessary to retain it.

In that light, I believe that Colin Smyth's amendment 95 allows for the right amount of periodic review and takes a proportionate and not too prescriptive approach.

Finlay Carson: I support the amendments in the names of Rachael Hamilton and Edward Mountain.

I am all for holding Government to account. I believe in transparency and accountability, and believe that Colin Smyth is trying to achieve that with his amendment 95, which would oblige the Government to provide an explanation for choosing not to amend sections 4 and 8 of the bill. However, amendment 95 would not oblige ministers to provide an explanation for changing the law, and I wonder why Mr Smyth does not agree that a change in the law should be justified. Perhaps he will explain in his summing up why he omitted to provide for that in amendment 95.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call the minister.

Màiri McAllan: Taken together, the amendments in the group would impose seven new reporting requirements that have various timescales and cover a wide range of issues. Some are directly relevant to the bill and some are not. If we were to agree to all the amendments, they would take considerable and disproportionate Scottish Government resources to fulfil, and there would be duplication, because many of the requirements are already covered by other statutory duties or regular reports.

That being said, the Scottish Government is committed to an open and transparent approach to legislation and, when additional reporting serves a useful purpose, I am happy to support it. Colin Smyth's amendment 95 is a good example of that.

I understand that licensing provisions are a key element of the bill. I recognise that there is, on the one hand, legitimate concern about how such provisions may be sought to be used as a loophole. On the other hand, there are fears that those provisions will not be available when they would be the only effective solution for protecting livestock and ground-nesting birds. By placing a duty on ministers to review the operation of the

licence provisions that are contained in sections 4 and 8, we will provide reassurance on how licences are being used and, where necessary, allow action to be taken to ensure that they operate in the intended way. I hope that my words about taking action will reassure Finlay Carson.

I support Colin Smyth's amendments, but I am afraid that I cannot support any of the other amendments in the group. Edward Mountain's amendment 96 would require the Scottish ministers to lay before Parliament, after only two years, an annual report on licences, and specifies, in 19 lines of detail, what that report should contain. I do not think that that is the right approach.

First, the Scottish Government has made clear a commitment to review the operations of all wildlife management licensing carried out by NatureScot. I have referred a number of times this evening to that work and to the fact that a sector-wide approach is the most appropriate. Secondly, I said at stage 2, and again this afternoon, that I will go as far as possible, given GDPR legislation, in providing detail about licences, but I must be able to consider that work in the round and be especially cognisant of data protection.

Similarly, on Rachael Hamilton's amendment 101, hare coursing is undoubtedly a cruel practice that persists in Scotland. That is why it is so important that the bill will help to tackle it. However, a specific report on the impacts of the bill on hare coursing is unnecessary and would duplicate on-going work—for example, under section 26B of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, the Scottish ministers are already required to report every calendar year on offences that relate to wildlife, and that includes information on incidences and prosecutions, and on research and advice.

Rachael Hamilton: There has been no improvement in the incidence of prosecutions for hare coursing. When the minister has seen a few more of the figures from the reporting mechanism that she has highlighted today, will she reconsider her comments?

Màiri McAllan: Rachael Hamilton's point is more about what we can do to improve the incidence of prosecutions for hare coursing and less about the mechanism by which we monitor the number of prosecutions and incidences. My views on amendment 101 stand.

Rachael Hamilton rightly referred to the point about penalties but, in turn, I point out that the penalties for hare coursing were reviewed in the report by Professor Poustie. Changes that he recommended were made recently in the Parliament through the Animals and Wildlife

(Penalties, Protections and Powers) (Scotland) Act 2020.

Similarly, Rachael Hamilton's amendment 103 would place a duty on ministers to report on the impact of the act on cultural heritage associated with hunting with dogs, as well as various other matters. I cannot support the amendment; I do not believe that it is relevant or necessary. As a matter of course, the Scottish Government will always seek to monitor and evaluate the impact of any new policies or legislation that is passed. However, amendment 103 would—flatly—introduce a duty to report on things that are not within the bill's remit.

On the welfare of dogs and Rachael Hamilton's suggestion of a cull, I am not aware of any evidence that there was widespread culling of hunting dogs when the two-dog limit was introduced in England and Wales. The Scottish Government supports the retention of working dogs or the rehoming of dogs that have come to the end of their working life. I take the opportunity to point out that section 19 of the Animal Health and Welfare (Scotland) Act 2006 makes it an offence for a person who is responsible for a protected animal such as a dog to cause that animal any unnecessary suffering by action or omission, or to permit another person to do so. For all those reasons, I do not support amendment 103.

Moving as quickly as possible to Rachael Hamilton's amendment 104, which would place a duty on ministers to report on

"the level and health of the fox population ... biodiversity, in particular ground nesting species ... and ... farmers' income"

and other matters, I agree that those issues are important. There is limited data on fox numbers. However, research referenced by Lord Bonomy suggests a stable population of about 23,000 animals, with some 41,000 being born and about 18,000 killed by various means of control each year.

The picture holds with regard to biodiversity and ground-nesting birds. Predator control is important, but only a small part of that depends on the use of dogs. As regards farmers' income and livestock, many farmers already carry out control without the use of dogs. Those who require dogs will be able to continue to use two dogs. Those issues are important in their own right but are not appropriate for a reporting duty.

The Government takes a similar position in relation to amendment 100, in Rachael Hamilton's name. Amendment 100 is on reporting on the impact of the act's provisions on the Scottish

Courts and Tribunals Service with regard to any increase in court procedures, on the Scottish Government departments responsible for implementing provisions of the act as regards staffing time, and on NatureScot with regard to increases in staffing time and so on. I do not believe that that is necessary or desirable.

Prior to the introduction of the bill, a full financial memorandum was produced, which was published on the Scottish Parliament website. The memorandum sets out the expected costs associated with the measures, including the cost to NatureScot and the Scottish Courts and Tribunals Service. That demonstrates again how much such work is on-going.

Finally, Rachael Hamilton's amendment 102 proposes another duty for Scottish ministers to report, after only two years, on the impact of provisions on any loss of jobs in rural areas and the mental health impact associated with a loss of social structure. I have said that we undertook a full business and regulatory impact assessment of the bill, which found that the provisions would have minimum impact on business. The bill will ensure that the law is effective in preventing the chasing and killing of wild mammals by packs of dogs, but there will continue to be a need for legal predator control and for the lawful use of dogs.

The bill's impact on particular aspects of rural society and mental health is an important issue but a vague and difficult concept to report on. I do not think that it would be sensible to require that by law, as proposed by Rachael Hamilton. There are also drafting issues—for example, it is not clear who would be covered by the term "apprentices", among others. For that reason, I cannot support any amendments in the group, with the exception of Colin Smyth's amendment 95.

Colin Smyth: I welcome the Government's support for my amendment 95, which would create a duty for ministers to review the operation of the licence scheme. Edward Mountain asked why I specified the licence scheme. It is because that is the main area of the bill on which we lack detailed information and it requires to be properly reviewed.

Edward Mountain: Does Colin Smyth agree that, in order to review the licence scheme, we need full details of all the licensing that has been carried out and that, in that case, my amendment 96 would support what he is trying to achieve?

Colin Smyth: In order to review the scheme, such information will be required. Part of my amendment 95 will cover that. I do not agree with Edward Mountain's amendment 96, which asks only for information, rather than a review.

Finlay Carson raised the point that the Government would be obliged to specify its

reasons if it did not intend to take any action but would not have to specify reasons if it proposed a change in the law. The reality is that it would have to specify the reasons for changing the law, because the parliamentary process would require that. The Government could not change the law unless it set out the reasons for that and what the specific changes were, which would be scrutinised by Parliament. The Government cannot change the law without coming to Parliament and specifying the reasons for that change.

On the other amendments in the group, which would create a requirement to report, reporting is one thing, but I believe that a review is stronger. Some areas merit regular reporting, but I do not agree with the list that is specified in Rachael Hamilton's amendments. The review mechanism that I have set out in my amendment 95 would at least provide an area in which reporting could take

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The question is, that amendment 95 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

Section 11—Offences relating to trail hunting

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 8 is on laying a scent for training dogs. Amendment 13, in the name of Christine Grahame, is grouped with amendment 14. I call Christine Grahame to move amendment 13 and speak to both amendments in the group.

Christine Grahame: First, I will speak to amendment 13, which replicates an amendment that I lodged at stage 2 as a probing amendment.

The purpose of that amendment was to prevent possible circumvention of the legislation by, for example, the practice of what is known as "clean booting". That involves having a human run some time ahead of a pack of dogs, with no animal or artificial animal scent with that person, the purpose of which might-and I simply say "might"-very well be to flush out and hunt foxes.

When I lodged that amendment at stage 2, the minister undertook to investigate the matter. I had not realised that that might happen, and I am pleased to see the minister's amendment. I accept amendment 14 and, in the circumstances, I will not move my amendment 13.

I have to say—I am not sooking up—that the minister's amendment is much better than mine. It includes the words "may by regulations". That is important, because the committee did not have the opportunity at stage 1, and certainly not at stage 2, to take evidence on the matter. In my view, it is not a good idea to introduce something mandatory when no evidence has been taken. The minister's amendment states that Scottish ministers

"may make regulations ... only if they consider that modifying the definition of trail hunting would contribute towards the protection of wild mammals from unlawful hunting using dogs."

It also states,

"Before laying a draft of a Scottish statutory instrument containing regulations ... the Scottish Ministers must consult such persons as they consider appropriate."

I think that that is absolutely correct. There is flexibility built in there, and it is open to evidence coming forward. Any change has to be made by affirmative procedure, which would committees, and indeed this Parliament, to check out the evidence before it is brought into the bill.

I am pleased, therefore, to recommend and support amendment 14 in the name of the minister and, given that it is so much better than mine, I am not moving amendment 13.

Amendment 13 moved—[Christine Grahame].

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call the minister to speak to amendment 14 and the other amendments in the group.

Màiri McAllan: As Christine Grahame said, she raised these matters at stage 2. Her amendment, which she resubmitted at stage 3, gave me much cause for consideration, and I thank her for that.

However, I cannot support amendment 13 as it stands for a number of reasons. completeness, I will set out some of the detail of that. However, I will principally go on to explain my amendment 14, which, in many ways, seeks to rise to the issues that Christine Grahame has rightly highlighted.

First, because of the way in which we have drafted the principal offence in the bill, which is hunting a wild mammal using a dog, her amendment's reference to allowing

"a dog to hunt ... or"

being

"reckless as to whether it does"

is not required. As Lord Bonomy highlighted in his review, hunting is, in this context, always an intentional activity.

There are some other inconsistencies with the language that I will not go into, on the basis of Christine Grahame's explanation of her intentions regarding the amendment. However, with regard to the wording on following

"an artificial or human scent",

I support the principle behind amendment 13. I understand why Christine Grahame lodged the amendment, and I acknowledge her desire to be vigilant in avoiding a loophole by which those who wish to continue hunting illegally could use drag hunting as a cover.

Regulating the use of dogs to find and follow non-animal-based scents, including human scents, was not included in the bill, as it does not directly or indirectly involve the use of dogs to hunt wild mammals. In addition, unlike the situation with trail hunting, we do not currently have evidence to suggest that drag hunting is being used as a cover for illegal activity, nor do we have evidence that wild mammals are being accidentally chased or killed in the course of drag hunting.

In the bill as it is drafted, if a person undertakes drag or clean-boot hunting and they allow their dog to chase or kill a wild mammal without taking "reasonable steps" to prevent it from doing so, they may have committed an offence under section 1. However, I recognise the concerns that have been raised by Christine Grahame and by the League Against Cruel Sports that people who seek to continue hunting illegally may, following passage of the bill, try to use such seemingly innocuous activities as a cover for something more difficult.

My amendment 14, if it is agreed to, will therefore add to the bill a regulation-making power that will allow Scottish ministers to extend the definition of trail hunting to include both animal and non-animal-based scents. That will allow Scottish ministers to make regulations to add other scents—for example, aniseed—to the definition of hunting, if evidence should come to light that trail hunting is continuing in a new form and that it poses a risk to wild mammals.

The power can be exercised only where

"Scottish ministers ... consider that modifying the definition ... would contribute towards the protection of wild mammals from unlawful hunting using dogs."

The power also allows for new exceptions to be created so that legitimate activity within the definition can continue.

Regulations would require consultation, and they would be subject to the affirmative procedure to give Parliament its place with scrutiny. I hope that we will not have to use that power but, given what has happened in England with trail hunting—we know that there are serious concerns that it is being used as a cover for illegal activity—it is important that we build safeguards into the bill to

allow us to take action in future should that prove necessary.

I thank Christine Grahame for bringing these matters to me and to the chamber, and I ask her not to press amendment 13—[Interruption.] I am just concluding. Christine Grahame said that she will not press the amendment. I ask her to support amendment 14 instead.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call Ariane Burgess for a brief contribution.

Ariane Burgess: For some context, trail hunting—directing dogs to chase after an animal-based scent—was invented in England after the Hunting Act 2004 came in. We have to remember that mounted hunts never went trail hunting until that was the only way that they could get around the law. The Scottish Government is therefore right to pre-emptively ban it by making trail hunting an offence in Scotland.

The minister's amendment 14 is very welcome, as it will give the Scottish ministers the power to change the definition of trail hunting if related forms of that activity begin to be used as a loophole for fox hunting. However, why not prevent that from the start? Why wait until after the fact and have to change the legislation later? Widening the definition of trail hunting now will not negatively impact on anyone except those who are determined to continue hunting with packs of dogs.

Christine Grahame: Obviously, I share the concerns, but Ariane Burgess must consider that the approach by the Parliament must be evidence based and tested by it. I do not want any of that to happen, and I very much agree with the minister that we require, for the sake of all parties, to have evidence. When there is evidence, flexibility is built into the primary legislation. It does not need to be amended.

Ariane Burgess: I agree with Christine Grahame, but I want to get the point across that mounted hunts never went trail hunting until that was the only way to get around the law. That is really important for us to understand.

One of the challenges around the bill is that we have had to legislate for things that will potentially happen in the future. I agree on the evidence issue. That is a challenging bit. That is what brought problems for the 2002 act, and that is why we are having to address the issue now.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call Christine Grahame to press or withdraw amendment 13 on the basis that it is deemed to have been moved.

Christine Grahame: Actually, I did not move it, Presiding Officer.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The member spoke to the amendment at reasonable length.

Christine Grahame: Okay. I will do whatever is necessary to move us along, so I am not pressing it and I am not winding up.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: You are withdrawing the amendment. Thank you very much.

Amendment 13, by agreement, withdrawn.

After section 11

Amendment 14 moved—[Màiri McAllan].

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The guestion is, that amendment 14 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

After section 12

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 9 is on an exception for training dogs. Amendment 97, in the name of Rachael Hamilton, is the only amendment in the group.

Rachael Hamilton: Amendment 97 creates an exception to allow the use of more than two dogs in training a juvenile dog for a lawful hunting purpose. It also outlines conditions that must be met in order to make such an activity lawful. The amendment is necessary to ensure that dogs can be trained to carry out specific tasks that are essential to the management of wildlife or the protection of livestock and crops. Without it, the bill will place severely restrictive limits on the ability to train dogs for those purposes.

I move amendment 97.

Màiri McAllan: The wording of amendment 97 is not clear, so I am grateful for Rachael Hamilton's explanation.

My reading is that, in contrast to other exceptions, which refer to searching for, stalking or flushing wild mammals, amendment 97 does not specify what using more than two dogs might entail. It appears that a person could use a pack of dogs to do any activity whatsoever, as long as they could argue that they were training a juvenile dog for a lawful hunting purpose. I fear that that would open a significant loophole that could potentially be used as a cover for illegal hunting, which is exactly what we are trying to stop.

There are other significant issues with the drafting of the amendment. For example, there is no definition of "juvenile dog", which means that it is left open to interpretation, which again would introduce a level of ambiguity for enforcement, which the bill, of course, seeks to remove. The specificity and clarity of the language that is used in the bill has been praised widely and is one of the reasons why Police Scotland has said that it will make enforcement easier.

For those reasons, I will not support amendment 97.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call Rachael Hamilton to wind up and press or withdraw amendment 97.

Rachael Hamilton: I have no further comments. I press amendment 97.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The question is, that amendment 97 be agreed to. Are we agreed?

Section 16—Deprivation orders

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Group 10 is on court orders. Amendment 15, in the name of Ariane Burgess, is grouped with amendments 16, 98, 99, 17 and 18.

Ariane Burgess: My amendments 15 to 18 are about ensuring that, when an offence has been committed, animal welfare is considered by the courts in the sentencing process. I thank the minister for working with me to bring an improved version of the amendments to the Parliament for stage 3.

As the minister explained to the committee at stage 1, the Proceeds of Crime (Scotland) Act 1995 applies to the bill. Therefore, the courts will have the power to confiscate property that is used to commit an offence under the bill, such as a quad bike.

Deprivation orders and seizure orders will result in the offender's dog or horse being taken away from them, so that they cannot use that animal to offend again. Amendments 15 and 17 would add to the conditions on those orders so that a court would have to consider the need to ensure the welfare of the dog or horse, regardless of whether the court ultimately orders it to be put down, sold or anything else. Amendments 16 and 18 would tidy up text elsewhere that is replicated in amendments 15 and 17.

Because of the way in which amendments 15 and 17 are drafted, the welfare considerations would not trump other considerations, such as the likelihood of the person continuing to use the animal to commit crimes in future. The court would simply be required to consider the welfare of the dog or horse alongside all other relevant factors when making its decision.

I believe that the amendments strike a balance between giving the courts the power to sanction people by removing their property and recognising that seizing animals such as horses and dogs will have an impact not just on the owner but on the animal

I move amendment 15.

Edward Mountain: Amendment 98, in my name, would insert a provision that would ensure that the court must state a reason for issuing a disqualification order. Under the bill as drafted, the court will have to give a reason for not issuing a disqualification order. I think that it is fair and equitable that the court should give a reason why it is issuing an order as well.

Amendment 99, in my name, seeks to give guidance to the court on what would be a reasonable period of disqualification from owning a dog or horse. I do not believe that it is fair to leave that open ended. The amendment suggests that the period should be up to 18 months for first and second offences and three years for a third offence, and that, for a fourth offence, the period should be up to the discretion of the court. That sliding scale would allow people who have perhaps committed a first offence and did not mean for that offence to occur not to be precluded from owning a dog for ever. That would be a severe blow to many people.

I am interested to hear the minister's comments on Ariane Burgess's amendments 15 to 18. The bill has certain descriptions on disqualification and the destruction of horses and dogs, and I would like to hear whether the minister feels that those are sufficient, because the welfare of the animals must be paramount.

Colin Smyth: I support amendments 15 and 17 and the consequential amendments 16 and 18, all of which are in the name of Ariane Burgess. The bill currently refers to the consideration of welfare only in relation to the destruction of a dog or horse. It is important that the welfare of animals is considered in the case of a sale or another disposal that the court orders, and not only when it comes to disposals that result in the destruction of an animal, as is the case under the bill at present.

Amendments 98 and 99, in the name of Edward Mountain, seek to constrain the discretion of the Scottish courts with regard to post-conviction orders. That would not allow the courts to take into account all the relevant circumstances, so I do not support those two amendments.

Màiri McAllan: At stage 2, I listened carefully to Ariane Burgess's reasons for her amendments. I said at the time that, although the wording did not work, I supported the principle and that I would be happy to work with her ahead of stage 3. I understand that, when considering deprivation and seizure orders in relation to animals, the courts routinely take into account the welfare of the animals to which the orders apply. However,

Ariane Burgess's amendments 15 to 18 will make clear in the bill that that consideration has to happen.

It is clear to me that, as has been narrated by Ariane Burgess, although deprivation and seizure orders can relate to inanimate objects, when we are discussing live sentient animals, we should have heightened regard for their welfare. I am therefore glad to have worked with Ariane Burgess on the amendments, and I am glad to support them.

Edward Mountain's amendment 98, which would require the court to give reasons for making a disqualification order on a first offence, is unnecessary because, in general, the courts provide reasons for any penalty or sentence that they choose to impose. That being said, the Animal Health and Welfare (Scotland) Act 2006 also imposes a duty on the courts to give their reasons for issuing a disqualification order. On this occasion, therefore, I am content to support amendment 98.

However, I cannot similarly support Edward Mountain's amendment 99, which seeks to limit the period for which a disqualification order may be granted in various circumstances. As Colin Smyth said, that would unnecessarily and unjustifiably fetter the discretion of the court in considering the appropriate period of time for which an order should be given effect. There may be many circumstances in which a long period of disqualification is appropriate, even for a first offence. In any case, a number of factors will be taken into account by the court in considering the appropriate sentence; it is not for us to fetter the court's discretion in that.

Ariane Burgess: I reiterate the point that animal welfare should be borne in mind by the courts when issuing sentences, because, after all, it is not the dog or horse that is guilty but the person who used it to hunt. In that light, I thank the minister for accepting my amendments.

I press amendment 15.

Section 25—Crown application: powers of entry

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The last group—group 11—is on Crown application. Amendment 105, in the name of Ariane Burgess, is grouped with amendment 106.

Ariane Burgess: Section 25 would establish a two-tier system in which law enforcement officers must obtain special permission to enter Crown land, but not any other land, to investigate potential offences relating to hunting with dogs. The law should apply equally to everyone, but section 25 will create a loophole that would make it easier for any illegal hunting activity on Crown land to evade prosecution, be that activity by persons who are in service to the Crown or anybody else who is hunting with dogs on Crown land

The Ferret revealed that registered fox hunts have recently been allowed on land that is owned by Forestry and Land Scotland, which is Crown land. Police must be able to enter that land to investigate reports of fox hunting or other suspicious hunting with dogs: they should not be impeded by requiring consent from the relevant authority. When it comes to protecting animal

welfare, there should be no loopholes—not even for the Crown.

I urge members to support my amendment 105, which would remove section 25. My amendment 106 is consequential on removal of section 25.

I move amendment 105.

Màiri McAllan: I understand Ariane Burgess's concerns and the reasons why she has lodged her amendments 105 and 106. I have carefully assessed their effect and whether there is any need for them. It is often necessary to make special provision for Crown land, primarily for reasons of national security, and particularly as regards the private estates of the King and, importantly, Ministry of Defence land, as is the case here. I should be clear that the existing requirement for Police Scotland to gain consent before entering Crown land does not prohibit entry, but simply sets a precondition for entry.

Ms Burgess's amendments, if agreed to, would remove the requirement for Police Scotland to have permission to enter Crown land, including MOD land, to investigate offences under the bill. I do not think that seeking authorisation from the body that is responsible for the land would undermine the operation of the legislation. Moreover, the provisions in the bill reflect the careful balancing of, on one hand, ensuring effective investigation of offences and, on the other, not impinging on the security and safety considerations of, for example, military exercises that are being carried out on MOD land.

The provisions in the bill are in keeping with those in other wildlife and forestry legislation, including the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, the Deer (Scotland) Act 1996 and the Forestry and Land Management (Scotland) Act 2018, and they mirror the approach that is taken in other acts that the Scottish Parliament has created more recently, including the Hate Crime and Public Order (Scotland) Act 2021 and the Fireworks and Pyrotechnic Articles (Scotland) Act 2022.

I also point out that the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002, which we are seeking to replace, did not bind the Crown in any way, so the bill represents a significant shift towards applying provisions to Crown land.

For all those reasons, I cannot support amendments 105 and 106.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I call Ariane Burgess to wind up and to press or seek to withdraw amendment 105.

Ariane Burgess: I thank the minister for her response.

The law should apply equally to everyone. There should not be one system for the Crown

and a different system for the public. We should not restrict the police from carrying out their duties, even on Crown land. I lodged amendment 106 so that the bill will not remove the ability of Police Scotland to enter Crown land.

I press amendment 105.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The result of the division is: For 27, Against 92, Abstentions 0.

Amendment 106 disagreed to.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: That ends stage 3 consideration of the bill. There will be a short pause before we move on.

The Presiding Officer (Alison Johnstone): As members will be aware, at this point in the proceedings, I am required under standing orders to decide whether, in my view, any provision of the bill relates to a protected subject matter—that is, whether it modifies the electoral system and franchise for Scottish parliamentary elections. In my view, no provision of the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill relates to a protected subject matter, so the bill does not require a supermajority to be passed at stage 3.

Before I invite the minister to open the debate, I call Michael Matheson to signify Crown consent to the bill.

The Cabinet Secretary for Net Zero, Energy and Transport (Michael Matheson): Presiding Officer, for the purposes of rule 9.11 of the standing orders, I advise Parliament that His Majesty, having been informed of the purport of the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill, has consented to place his prerogative and interests,

in so far as they are affected by the bill, at the disposal of the Parliament for the purposes of the bill.

Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill

The Presiding Officer (Alison Johnstone): The next item of business is a debate on motion S6M-07600, in the name of Màiri McAllan, on the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill at stage 3. I invite members who wish to speak in the debate to press their request-to-speak buttons.

The Minister for Environment and Land Reform (Màiri McAllan): I am pleased to introduce my first bill to Parliament and to open the stage 3 debate on the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill. As members will be aware, the bill was originally scheduled to be introduced in 2020. However, owing to the pandemic, it had to be delayed. With that in mind, I thank my predecessor, Mairi Gougeon, for the significant part that she played in developing the provisions that are set out before us this afternoon.

Today's debate is the culmination of an eightyear process of consultation and policy development that started with a Government commitment in December 2015 to review the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002. That included an independent review of the 2002 act, which was undertaken by Lord Bonomy, and two public consultations that, between them, received more than 25,000 responses. That large number of responses clearly demonstrates that there is, and continues to be, significant public interest in that legislation, and I have always been mindful of that.

When I took over responsibility for this policy area, I committed to listening to all views and to seeking consensus where possible. Over the past year and a half, I have met a wide range of organisations and individuals who were supportive of and had concerns about the proposals. As far as possible, I have tried to address those concerns in the bill as introduced and in the amendments that were lodged and accepted. I know that the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee has done similarly, and I thank it for its careful scrutiny and consideration of the bill.

I am also grateful for the support that I have received from MSPs of all parties for my amendments, and I thank members of all parties, with whom I have had productive discussions throughout the bill's passage. That has led to agreement on constructive amendments, which I have no doubt have improved the bill.

There is no doubt that there has been a clear cultural shift in our attitudes towards wildlife in the past few decades. Practices such as hare coursing, fox hunting, badger baiting and dog fighting, which were once legal activities and, quite unbelievably, considered to be spectator sports, are no longer acceptable.

It has now been more than 20 years since the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Bill was introduced to the Scottish Parliament. Once it was agreed to, Scotland became the first part of the United Kingdom to ban fox hunting, and that has paved the way for the bill that we have been considering today.

I am proud to say that, since the passage of the 2002 act, a whole generation has been born and grown up in a Scotland where the barbaric practice of using a dog to chase and kill wild animals has been illegal. It is clear from the correspondence that I have received that many members of the public did not understand why we needed new provisions, as they believed that the activities were already illegal. However, as Lord Bonomy highlighted in his report, and as the evidence that we have heard from many, including Police Scotland, showed, the 2002 act, which at the time was rightly regarded as pioneering, was flawed. Those flaws have meant that the legislation did not have the intended impact.

If the bill is passed tonight, I am of the firm belief that it will have an immediate effect by modernising and strengthening our legislation to assist enforcement authorities in dealing with those who would persist in illegal hunting.

I know that some people continue to have concerns about the potential impact that the bill will have on lawful pursuits such as rough shooting, and I have listened carefully to those who have expressed such concerns. I understand the root of those concerns. I have said all along that the Scottish Government appreciates the contribution that rural sport makes to our economy and that we do not intend to ban recreational activities—

Finlay Carson (Galloway and West Dumfries) (Con): The minister said that she listened to stakeholders. Will she tell us what changes she introduced in the bill that would prevent the effective banning of rough shooting, which is a legal activity?

Màiri McAllan: I have had extensive engagement with stakeholders on all aspects of the bill and probably on none more than the topic of rough shooting, not least in the additional scrutiny session that Finlay Carson conducted as convener of the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee. The purpose of that has been to explain to stakeholders how rough shooting can still take place within the bill's provisions. Equally, I have committed to working with industry on guidance so that it understands what to expect following the bill's passage.

I also understand and have been clear about the need to control predators to protect livestock, and that it is sometimes necessary to manage native and non-native species to protect vulnerable birds, such as curlews, lapwings and capercaillies.

I believe that the new two-dog limit, in conjunction with a practical and effective but narrowly defined licensing scheme, will allow there to be an effective balance and will protect wildlife while facilitating legal control.

On the other hand, I have also listened to concerns that were raised by animal welfare organisations such as the Scottish Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, OneKind and the League against Cruel Sports that the 2002 act did not put a stop to illegal hunting and that, unless we built in stringent safeguards, those activities would continue.

That is why the bill sets a two-dog limit, restricts the circumstances in which a licence can be available, and gives NatureScot the power to limit the number of days a licence can be issued for and to impose conditions such as the maximum number of dogs and guns.

It is also why the bill contains provision to ban trail hunting. I have talked about the need to ensure the highest standard of wild mammal welfare and the need to manage wildlife. Those are not mutually exclusive. The bill has been designed to ensure that, where it is necessary, using dogs to control wildlife is done in a manner that does not lead to unnecessary suffering.

I have said it before, but it bears repeating that the chasing and killing of wild mammals with packs of dogs has no place in modern Scotland. Members from all parties across the chamber voted to support the general principles of the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill at stage 1. At this final stage, I urge all members again to vote in support of it.

I move,

That the Parliament agrees that the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill be passed.

Rachael Hamilton (Ettrick, Roxburgh and Berwickshire) (Con): Fourteen years after the Scottish Parliament passed the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002, the Scottish Government asked Lord Bonomy to review the act and report on how it could be improved. Bonomy's review identified insufficiencies and uncertainties in the operation of the 2002 act, and that is what this bill seeks to address. However, the review also unequivocally recognised the need to control wild mammal populations and the important role

that legal and restrained hunting can play in providing that management.

This debate has provoked passionate views, and I completely understand why. We are all invested in the protection of animals and the need to prevent cruelty, but the framing of the debate often overlooks the practicalities and realities. It is often presented as a one-track issue—a narrow issue where we can either be pro or against animal welfare. I am afraid that that argument is flawed and does not help anybody. It does not help animal welfare, it does not serve our farmers on the front line and it does not help biodiversity or our environment.

If this was a straightforward choice between protecting animal welfare or not, we would be 100 per cent behind protecting animal welfare, but it is not, and we do this Parliament a disservice by pretending that it is. The debate is so often framed around hunting for sport, but what we are discussing here today is far removed from that. This bill should really be about the balance between animal welfare and biodiversity. If there is no hunting with dogs, predators will be left to attack other animals. Those predators, left unchecked, will attack livestock such as lambs and sheep, or ground-nesting birds such as the curlew, the capercaillie and other vulnerable species. This is not a simple bill that protects animal welfare; it is a bill that protects some animals' welfare at the expense of others.

Then there is the damage to biodiversity, our environment and crops if controlled hunting to curb predators is no longer allowed. The RSPB recently warned that 50 per cent of Scotland's species have declined in abundance since 1994. We should look at why that has happened. Scotland ranks 212th out of 240 countries and territories for biodiversity. We should be asking whether the bill will improve that record or, as I fear, keep us lagging behind the rest of the world.

When we consider the changes to the bill, we should look at the important role of managed hunting in Scotland's wildlife conservation toolkit, yet the bill seeks to degrade that toolkit, just when we need it most. Placing further restrictions on our ability to effectively manage wildlife at a time when iconic species such as the capercaillie are under threat of extinction is plainly irresponsible. One of the primary drivers of population decline in capercaillie, among other ground-nesting birds, is predation by foxes, yet the ability to prevent that predation, which was allowed by the 2002 act, is harmed by the bill, since it places restrictions on how dogs can be used to control predators in the context of protecting vulnerable species.

Jim Fairlie (Perthshire South and Kinrossshire) (SNP): Will the member take an intervention?

Rachael Hamilton: I will not, I am afraid, because my time has been cut.

During the stage 1 debate, the minister informed the chamber that she had studied the 2002 act during her legal training, because it was a prime example of poorly drafted legislation full of deficiencies and legal uncertainty. My concern is that the bill that we have before us today will be studied by ecologists in years to come as a bill that ignored the views of experts and pinned the final nail in the coffin for many of Scotland's endangered species.

The bill ignores the realities of hunting with dogs—which have been outlined by organisations such as the Scottish Countryside Alliance, the British Association for Shooting and Conservation, NFU Scotland and others—while legislating on matters that seem to be misunderstood by key decision makers. As I mentioned during stage 1 proceedings, animal welfare has been at the heart of this debate. I have already discussed the havoc wrought upon vulnerable species, and the NFUS has voiced concern about the effect of the bill on the ability of farms to protect livestock.

I will come to a close, because I know that time is tight. The Scottish National Party Government might have been right to revisit the 2002 act on the back of the Bonomy review, but it has done so in a way that is typical of it. It ignores the evidence around the issue, and the views of countless stakeholders and those in rural Scotland have been ignored.

We do not have faith in the bill. It will not help animal welfare, and we fear that it will have a negative impact on biodiversity, our natural environment and those who protect, support and look after it.

Colin Smyth (South Scotland) (Lab): In 2002, the Parliament sought to end the barbaric practice of mounted hunts using packs of dogs to chase foxes to exhaustion and then for those dogs to be set on the fox to brutally kill it. Two decades on, some hunts continue to ride roughshod over the letter and spirit of that ban.

Today was a chance to right that wrong, scrap the loopholes that are being exploited and end the cruelty of hunting with packs of dogs once and for all. Sadly, the bill does not do that. It will not close all of the loopholes that exist and it will not end the use of packs of dogs; it merely licenses their use. However, cruelty cannot be licensed. We cannot say, on the one hand, that using a pack of dogs is cruel because it increases the risk of dogs chasing and killing a wild mammal while, on the other hand, say that we will continue to allow packs of dogs to be used if the hunt has a licence—which is

what the SNP is saying. Handing out a licence will not make that any less cruel. Those who have exploited the current legislation, which was passed more than 20 years ago, will do all that they can to exploit this legislation through licensing, and they have every reason to believe that they could be successful, because the SNP and the Tories would not accept amendments that sought to ensure that any licensing application would be subject to best practice and ethical wildlife management, even though that is the direction of travel that I am confident that we will, ultimately, go down.

When NatureScot gave evidence to the committee, it said:

"We are fairly well aligned with the ethical principles".—
[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 22 June 2022; c 24.]

Today was a test of how committed the Government is to that approach, and it has not met that test.

When the minister gave evidence to the committee on 29 June 2022, she said that

"a licence has to be construed as the option that is available when there are no other options."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 29 June 2022; c 18.]

However, the bill is almost silent on the criteria to determine that, and an opportunity to genuinely make it a last resort has been missed.

The bill contains a number of cruel exemptions, such as continuing to allow birds of prey as a method of killing, which is no less cruel than using dogs to kill. It allows for the continuation of the use of dogs below ground to control wild mammals. The bill may well limit the number of dogs below ground to one, but if it is cruel to use more than one dog below ground then it is cruel to use any number of dogs below ground. It lacks credibility to say that you can control a dog below ground that will not see or hear you. The Government admitted that in its revised explanatory notes to the bill.

The bill does improve on existing legislation, with the limit in most cases—but sadly not all—to the use of two dogs for searching and flushing out foxes, and the inclusion of new offences that will prevent trail hunting from emerging in Scotland, as it has in England.

The bill has also been strengthened—albeit marginally—since it was introduced, as the result of amendments by several members. I am pleased that my amendments to review licensing every five years have been accepted, as have my amendments to ensure that dogs are not used to kill injured animals.

Ending hunting with packs of dogs was unfinished business when the bill was first

proposed. It has no place in modern Scotland; that is the view of the public in urban areas and of the vast majority of those in rural communities. Those of us who represent rural communities know that it is not who we are and it is not what our communities believe in. The bill nudges the bar towards less hunting with packs of dogs, so it will receive Labour's support, but the use of licensing means that the risk remains, and that an opportunity to end it once and for all has been missed. Sadly, it remains unfinished business.

I end by thanking those who have contributed to the bill, those who play such an important part by living and working in our countryside, including those who are tasked with managing our land, and the many animal welfare charities, such as the League Against Cruel Sports, OneKind and others, who give a voice to those who cannot speak for themselves and campaign with such passion day in, day out. I am really proud of the campaign work that they do to improve animal welfare, but we have some way to go. My advice to them is: keep up the fight.

Ariane Burgess (Highlands and Islands) (Green): For the vast majority of the Scottish public, it is unacceptable that fox hunting still takes place in our country. Most of us believed that fox hunting was banned just over 20 years ago yet loopholes in the law have enabled fox hunting to continue, on horseback or on foot, under the cover of legal activities. Today, those loopholes begin to close. The Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill will help the police and courts to prosecute illegal activity. It will give greater protection to foxes, hares, badgers and other wild animals.

That is thanks to the tireless campaigning of animal welfare organisations such as the League Against Cruel Sports, OneKind and Scottish Badgers. It is also thanks to the Scottish Government for its strong position that chasing and killing wild mammals with dogs has no place in modern Scotland.

The bill has been strengthened through the parliamentary process. We have added a duty to review the licensing scheme and take the required action, which could potentially mean removing it all together, and through my amendments, we have added a duty on the courts to consider animal welfare in sentencing.

The bill is a big improvement on the current legislation, but will it stop fox hunting? That remains to be seen. Despite the best efforts of the Scottish Greens and Labour to close the loopholes, the bill still contains many that are bound to be exploited by those who are determined to continue their cruel pastime.

I tried to remove the exceptions that allow forms of hunting with dogs for sport, hunting with dogs underground and hunting with dogs under licence. I also tried to remove the requirement for the police to obtain special permission to investigate any hunting with dogs on Crown or Government land.

That is not a hypothetical concern. Fox hunts have been allowed on land owned by Forestry and Land Scotland. Why set up additional barriers to investigating such cases? Why create a loophole for the Crown? King Charles previously lobbied to scrap the Westminster bill to ban fox hunting in England and Wales. However, in Scotland, 87 per cent of people—and 100 per cent of young people—want fox hunting to be banned.

The Scottish Parliament and the Scottish Government must be able to develop and pass our own laws, to set the direction of travel for the Scotland that we and the Scottish public want to see in the future, without our democracy being undermined by interference from Westminster or by the monarchy's historic privileges. Would those of us in the Scottish Parliament who want this country to gain independence want fox hunting to continue in an independent Scotland? Of course not. If we want to live in a modern, independent Scotland, we must start legislating for that future.

The commitment made by the Scottish Government and the Greens to the upcoming species licensing review, which the minister spoke about earlier, will be the next opportunity to take a closer look at licensed hunting and to push for ethical wildlife management. We must monitor the impact of the bill closely, and the licensing scheme in particular. Any evidence that it is being used as a loophole must be acted on immediately, instead of waiting 20 more years.

The Scottish Greens have always taken a strong position against blood sports. That is why blood sports are excluded from the Bute house agreement: so that we can go further to stamp out animal cruelty. The Greens are determined to end licensed hunting with dogs as soon as practically possible, and to finally deliver a watertight ban on fox hunting.

Beatrice Wishart (Shetland Islands) (LD): As deputy convener of the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, I thank the clerks, the bill team, committee convener Finlay Carson and my committee colleagues for all their work on the bill. I am grateful to all the organisations and individuals who submitted evidence and provided briefings throughout the stages of the bill.

The Scottish Liberal Democrats support the aims of the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill to tighten up inconsistencies in the 2002 act, in a way that balances the need to protect animal welfare with the need for effective pest control in our rural and agricultural areas. The Scottish Liberal Democrats are in favour of a workable licensing scheme, based on evidence, that enables the use of more than two dogs in certain circumstances. A sensible scheme is needed to ensure that effective pest control can continue. The proposed licensing scheme in the bill reflects evidence that the committee heard that, in some instances, more than two dogs are required to flush a wild mammal from cover for quick dispatch.

The initial draft of the bill stated that licences for management of wild mammals would be granted for 14 days within 14 consecutive days. From conversations with stakeholders, that appeared unnecessarily restrictive. I supported amendments from the minister at stage 2 to change that to 14 days in six consecutive months. I believe that that gives the necessary flexibility to create a workable licensing scheme for pest control.

Another aspect of the licences is that an application for a licence can be made by a sole landowner, jointly by a group of landowners or by the person who will carry out the hunting activity, with permission of the landowner. A key consideration for the licence is the terrain where the activity will take place, so licences will correspond to a particular area.

The requirement to get landowner permission for hunting with dogs was unclear to me in situations in which there are joint landowners for one piece of land or where ownership of a piece of land is split between multiple landowners. I lodged amendments at stage 2 to clarify that. I was satisfied with the minister's explanation that when interpreting legislation, the use of the singular includes the plural and vice versa. That means that, where the bill refers to getting permission from the landowner, "landowner" can be read as "landowners" depending on the circumstances. I am grateful to the minister for meeting me to discuss the bill and for providing explanations of her amendments.

At stage 1, I called for criteria for the licensing scheme to be developed in collaboration with stakeholders. I welcome the minister's commitment to working with stakeholders to create guidance on licensing.

The committee heard evidence about rough shooting and concerns about how it will operate under the bill. I welcome the minister's commitment to continue to work with the industry on the issue.

We did not support amendments today that would have either further expanded or restricted the scope of the bill. We believe that the bill achieves its aims to balance priorities. We supported amendments that created obligations on the Scottish ministers to conduct reviews every five years of the licensing scheme's operation and to report on part 1 of the bill within two years. Reporting and analysis are important to ensure that the bill achieves its aims and that licences are workable.

Respecting and enabling those who make their living off the land and having good animal welfare standards are not mutually exclusive. The vast majority of people who work on the land live in harmony with that land. Scottish Liberal Democrats will support the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill today at stage 3.

The Presiding Officer: We move to winding-up speeches.

Edward Mountain (Highlands and Islands) (Con): As I have been allowed only two minutes for my closing speech, I am afraid that I will take no interventions.

I have to say that I am deeply disappointed by the final drafting of the bill, following the stage 3 scrutiny. I do not support animal cruelty, but the bill has seriously limited our ability to manage wildlife, thus putting at risk the protection and enhancement of our native flora and fauna.

I believe that the Parliament, in its wish to ban mounted hunts, has shown the true divide between countryside and urban voters. Here we are spending hours discussing hunting with dogs while the national health service is under pressure, schoolteachers are on strike and our ferry service crumbles. This debate has shown how tone deaf the Government is to the concerns of the countryside. I believe that the bill is one fuelled by ideology, not practicality.

I cannot and will not support the bill. I am afraid that it will lead to a further disconnect between our countryside and the urban areas—a disconnect that I believe the Government will ultimately answer for.

Màiri McAllan: It has been a genuine privilege to work on the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill. I thank all stakeholders with whom I have had extensive engagement, and I thank the Scottish Government bill team, who have worked incredibly hard. I hope that the team will take tonight off, before we get back to grouse moor reform tomorrow. I jest—but in all seriousness, a huge

amount of work has been involved, and I thank the team for that.

From the beginning, my motivation has been to finally end illegal hunting with dogs in Scotland. As we know, it has been illegal for 20 years but, despite best efforts, it has persisted. Through the bill, we therefore sought to close loopholes in previous legislation and to take action to prevent other loopholes from opening, thereby future proofing our ban.

In steering through the bill, my officials and I have sought from the very beginning to end illegal activity once and for all, in the pursuit of the highest animal welfare standards, but without unduly impinging on legal and legitimate activity, and acknowledging the needs of farmers, land managers and environmental groups. That has required widespread engagement stakeholders and MSPs. It has required close attention to the Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee's observations and the sessions that it undertook. Ultimately, it has required assessment of what are finely balanced issues.

An example of that is one of the principal provisions in the bill: the two-dog limit. That puts the onus of control far more on the person who is purporting to hunt, and it makes breaches far more readily detectable by law enforcement. It is a significant step forward. However, in instituting the two-dog limit. I would not ignore the evidence of Lord Bonomy to the RAINE Committee that, in certain circumstances, two dogs would not be sufficient. It is right that the provision applies consistently across the piece and to all types of hunting, and without exceptions applied to certain types of hunting, as was called for in relation to rough shooting. Equally, however, the licensing scheme provides a very narrowly drawn but workable solution where there is no other effective option.

Likewise, I have sought to make the greatest possible progress on the issues of dogs underground. I heard the welfare concerns on the one hand but, equally, I heard about the lack of alternative options and the risk of worsening welfare outcomes. I therefore worked to find a solution that protected the welfare of dogs and foxes as far as possible, including by reducing the number of dogs to one, excluding mink from the exception and providing conditions on ensuring welfare.

On trail hunting, we have pre-empted potential loopholes. We have recognised what has happened in England and taken action to prevent it from happening here. We have future proofed the bill by taking a regulation-making power in relation to any future issues on drag hunting. I

again thank my colleague Christine Grahame for her work on that.

I am a little disappointed that Opposition members have descended into a little bit of negativity in their closing comments. However, in contrast to that, and as an antidote to it, I would like to quote Lord Bonomy, who said:

"may I say that I regard the bill as a very well-crafted piece of legislation? It solves the problems that I identified about the loose and variable use of language. It makes everything much clearer and simpler, which, in itself, should be a great incentive for better enforcement of the law, because the police and the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service were struggling with the effective detection and prosecution of offenders."—[Official Report, Rural Affairs, Islands and Natural Environment Committee, 15 June 2022; c 41.]

On 13 February 2002, our predecessors in the Parliament voted to pass the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002. I hope that we will follow their lead today and will vote to pass the Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill.
