# **Cross-Party Group Application**

#### Introduction

- 1. In accordance with the provisions on Cross-Party Groups (CPGs) set out in section 6 of the Code of Conduct (the Code), proposals for the establishment of CPGs in the Scottish Parliament must be submitted to the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee (the Committee) for its approval.
- 2. There is one proposed Group for the Committee's consideration.

# Proposed CPG on Heart and Circulatory Diseases

3. The registration form submitted by the proposed Group is attached at Annexe A to this note.

# Consideration by the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee

4. Paragraph 18 of Section 6 of the Code states "...one of the proposed Group's MSP office bearers (usually the Convener) will be invited to attend a meeting of the Committee to explain the justification for the proposed Group." Colin Smyth MSP has been invited to the meeting to discuss registration of the proposed Group.

# **Purpose**

- 5. Paragraph 19 Section 6 of the Code states "the Committee will pay particular attention to a proposed Group's purpose. If the Committee considers that a proposed Group is not in the public interest but is intended, for example, to further particular commercial interests, the proposed Group will not be accorded recognition. The Committee will also consider whether the purpose of a proposed Group overlaps the remit of an existing Group. If there is any overlap proposed Groups are asked to provide justification as to why their aims could not effectively be achieved within an existing Group".
- 6. The stated purpose of the proposed Group is—

- To act as a channel of communications between the Scottish Parliament and people affected by heart disease, healthcare professionals and researchers.
- To identify areas for action in the detection, diagnosis and treatment of heart disease in Scotland; the provision of recovery & care services in Scotland and identify any issues relating to out of hospital cardiac arrest survival, and to campaign for improvement.
- To keep abreast of any new research and evidence relating to heart and circulatory disease and ensure that the medical research environment in Scotland is best resourced and placed to support research and innovation relating to heart and circulatory disease.
- To monitor the implementation of the Heart Disease Action Plan, the Women's Health Plan (in relation to heart disease) and the OHCA strategy for Scotland and work with the Scottish Government to ensure full implementation.
- 7. The proposed Group does not consider its remit overlaps with any other existing Group.

# Membership

- 8. Paragraph 8 of Section 6 of the Code requires group membership to include at least five MSPs, with at least one MSP from each of the parties or groups represented on the Parliamentary Bureau. The Committee has previously agreed that there should be a general waiver of this Rule in the current Session and Groups are now required to have five MSPs from the majority of parties represented on the Parliamentary Bureau. The proposed Group meets this requirement.
- 9. The MSP membership (by party) of the proposed Group is as follows—
  - Karen Adam MSP, Jenni Minto MSP, Paul McLennan MSP, Scottish National Party
  - Alexander Stewart MSP, Scottish Conservative and Unionist Party
  - Colin Smyth MSP, Scottish Labour Party
- 10. Paragraph 9 of Section 6 of the Code entitles groups to contain members from outwith the Parliament. The proposed Group has listed no non-MSP member in the individual category. The proposed group have provided a list of non-MSP member organisations which can be found at Annexe A.

#### **Office Bearers**

11. Paragraph 10 of Section 6 of the Code requires one MSP to be Convener of the Group and there to be at least one other MSP office bearer. The proposed Group

meets this requirement: Colin Smyth MSP, Karen Adam MSP and Alexander Stewart MSP are Co-Conveners of the proposed Group.

# **Financial Benefits and Subscription**

- 12. The registration form indicates that there are no financial benefits related to the group. It is noted that the British Heart Foundation will provide secretarial and treasury support to the group which is estimated to come under the £500 threshold.
- 13. The registration form also indicates that members of the proposed Group will not be charged a subscription.

- 14. At agenda item 2 the Committee is invited to discuss any aspects of the application for recognition of the proposed Cross-Party Group on—
  - Heart and Circulatory Diseases with Colin Smyth MSP

  - To identify areas for action in the detection, diagnosis and treatment of heart disease in Scotland; the provision of recovery & care services in Scotland and identify any issues relating to out of hospital cardiac arrest survival, and to campaign for improvement.
  - To keep abreast of any new research and evidence relating to heart and circulatory disease and ensure that the medical research environment in Scotland is best resourced and placed to support research and innovation relating to heart and circulatory disease.
  - To monitor the implementation of the Heart Disease Action Plan, the Women's Health Plan (in relation to heart disease) and the OHCA strategy for Scotland and work with the Scottish Government to ensure full implementation.
- 2. Why the group is in the public interest

There are an estimated 700,000 people living with heart and circulatory diseases in Scotland. An ageing and growing population and improved survival rates from heart and circulatory events could see these numbers rise still further.

Prevalence rates for heart and circulatory diseases in the most deprived areas of Scotland are significantly higher than those in the least.

Heart and circulatory diseases cause more than 1 in 4 (27per cent) of all deaths in Scotland, or 17,000 deaths each year - that's nearly 50

people per day or 1,500 per month.

Around 5,100 people under the age of 75 in Scotland die from heart and circulatory diseases each year.

Sex based inequalities in the detection, diagnosis and treatment of heart disease in Scotland.

Poverty and health inequalities in relation to heart disease.

Remote and rural inequalities in relation to heart disease.
