## **Town Centres and Retail**

### Introduction

- 1. This paper has been prepared for the Economy and Fair Work Committee to aid Committee members during the seventh evidence session of the Committee's inquiry into town centres and retail.
- 2. The remit of the inquiry is to—
  - Identify the new realities of retail and ecommerce in Scotland and the resulting impact on town centres. What is the subsequent policy response needed to create living and resilient town centres?
