- It was set up under the <u>Scottish Commission for Human Rights Act 2006</u> (as amended). The SHRC is accountable to the people of Scotland through the Scottish Parliament and is accredited as an A-Status National Human Rights Institution within the United Nations (UN) human rights system

 - Promote human rights by raising awareness and understanding; and
 - Encourage best practice in relation to human rights
- 4. At this meeting, the Committee will receive an update from the Scottish Human Rights Commission following the recent publication of its <u>annual report</u> for April 2021 March 2022.
