Food Standards Scotland

Background

- Food Standards Scotland (FSS) was established on 1 April 2015 as the new public sector food body for Scotland. Its remit covers all aspects of the food chain which can impact on public health. Prior to this, FSS was known as the Food Standards Agency Scotland and had a similar remit.
- 2. The FSS website states its mission:
 - "To be Scotland's leading authority on food safety, standards and healthy eating; using data and evidence to provide assurance and advice that inspires consumer confidence and improves public health."
- 3. As set out under the <u>Food (Scotland) Act 2015</u>, FSS have three objectives in connection with protecting the health and wellbeing of consumers:
 - To protect the public from risks to health which may arise in connection with the consumption of food;
 - To improve the extent to which members of the public have diets which are conducive to good health;
 - To protect the other interests of consumers in relation to food.
- 4. FSS have a five year strategy from 2021 to 2026 entitled <u>Healthy</u>, <u>Safe</u>, <u>Sustainable</u>: <u>Driving Scotland's Food Future</u>, and a three year <u>Corporate Plan</u> which describes the work that will be undertaken to deliver the strategy between 2021-24.
- 5. FSS published its most recent annual report and accounts on 9 December 2022.
